## A BILL

To ban the use of ortho-phthalate chemicals as food contact substances.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

**3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Protect Our Food

5 From Phthalate Contamination Act".

Mrs. FEINSTEIN (for herself and Mr. BLUMENTHAL) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

## 1SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON USE OF ORTHO-PHTHALATE2CHEMICALS AS FOOD CONTACT SUBSTANCES,3INCLUDING FOOD PACKAGING MATERIALS.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi5 sion of law, effective on the date that is 2 years after the
6 date of enactment of this Act—

7 (1) the use of any ortho-phthalate chemical as
8 a food contact substance shall be deemed to be un9 safe for the purposes of the application of clause
10 (2)(C) of section 402(a) of the Federal Food, Drug,
11 and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. 342(a));

(2) any regulation previously issued under section 409 of such Act (21 U.S.C. 348) prescribing
the conditions under which any ortho-phthalate
chemical may be safely used as a food contact substance shall have no force or effect; and

17 (3) the Secretary of Health and Human Serv-18 ices (referred to in this Act as the "Secretary") shall 19 object to any notification of an intended use of an 20 ortho-phthalate chemical as a food contact substance 21 submitted under section 409(h)(1) of such Act, and 22 may not issue regulations prescribing any conditions 23 under which any ortho-phthalate chemical may be 24 safely used as a food contact substance.

25 (b) ALTERNATIVE SUBSTANCES.—Notwithstanding
26 any other provision of law, beginning on the date that is
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2 years after the date of enactment of this Act, in acting 1 2 in response to any petition under section 409 of the Fed-3 eral Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act (21 U.S.C. 348) to 4 establish safety with respect to a food contact substance 5 that the Secretary determines to be an alternative to an ortho-phthalate chemical, in addition to the criteria under 6 7 subsection (c) of such section 409, the Secretary shall con-8 sider potential adverse effects of exposure to the substance 9 on vulnerable populations, including pregnant women, infants, children, the elderly, and populations with high ex-10 11 posure, including workers who are exposed through production practices or handling of final products. 12

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
