A BILL

To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to acquire certain non-Federal land in the State of Pennsylvania for inclusion in the Fort Necessity National Battlefield.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Fort Necessity Na-
- 5 tional Battlefield Land Acquisition Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 7 In this Act:

1	(1) Battlefield.—The term "Battlefield"
2	means the Fort Necessity National Battlefield in the
3	State of Pennsylvania.
4	(2) Non-federal land.—
5	(A) IN GENERAL.—The term "non-Federal
6	land" means the approximately 157 acres of
7	land in Farmington, Pennsylvania, owned by
8	Marie Rush.
9	(B) Inclusion.—The term "non-Federal
10	land" includes the historic Braddock Road
11	trace surrounding the land described in sub-
12	paragraph (A).
13	(3) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
14	the Secretary of the Interior.
15	SEC. 3. ACQUISITION OF LAND FOR FORT NECESSITY NA-
16	TIONAL BATTLEFIELD, PENNSYLVANIA.
17	(a) In General.—The Secretary may acquire, by
18	donation or purchase, the non-Federal for inclusion in the
19	Battlefield.
20	(b) BOUNDARY REVISION.—On acquisition of the
21	non-Federal land by the Secretary—
22	(1) the non-Federal land shall be incorporated
23	in, and administered as part of, the Battlefield; and

1 (2) the boundary of the Battlefield shall be re-2 vised to reflect the acquisition of the non-Federal 3 land.
