Mr. WELCH introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Agriculture, Nutrition, and Forestry

A BILL

To amend the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 to improve the Rural Energy for America Program, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Rural Energy Equity
5 Act of 2023”.

6 **SEC. 2. RURAL ENERGY FOR AMERICA PROGRAM.**

7 Section 9007 of the Farm Security and Rural Invest-
8 ment Act of 2002 (7 U.S.C. 8107) is amended—

9 (1) in subsection (b)—

1 (A) in the subsection heading, by striking
2 “ENERGY AUDITS AND RENEWABLE ENERGY”
3 and inserting “PROJECT”;

4 (B) in paragraph (1)—
5 (i) in subparagraph (A), by inserting
6 “, including for purposes of reducing the
7 carbon footprint of the agricultural pro-
8 ducer and rural small business” before the
9 semicolon; and

10 (ii) in subparagraph (B), by inserting
11 “, including for purposes of reducing the
12 carbon footprint of the agricultural pro-
13 ducer and rural small business” before the
14 period at the end;

15 (C) in paragraph (4)—
16 (i) in subparagraph (B), by redesign-
17 nating clauses (i) and (ii) as subclauses (I)
18 and (II), respectively, and indenting appro-
19 priately;

20 (ii) by redesignating subparagraphs
21 (A) and (B) as clauses (i) and (ii), respec-
22 tively, and indenting appropriately;

23 (iii) in the matter preceding clause (i)
24 (as so redesignated), by striking “A recipi-
25 ent” and inserting the following:

- 1 “(A) IN GENERAL.—A recipient”; and
- 2 (iv) by adding at the end the fol-
- 3 lowing:
- 4 “(B) MULTIPLE ACTIVITIES.—A recipient
- 5 of a grant under paragraph (1) may use the
- 6 grant to carry out 1 or more activities described
- 7 in subparagraph (A).”; and
- 8 (D) in paragraph (6)—
- 9 (i) by striking “A recipient” and in-
- 10 serting the following:
- 11 “(A) IN GENERAL.—A recipient”; and
- 12 (ii) by adding at the end the fol-
- 13 lowing:
- 14 “(B) UNDERSERVED PRODUCERS AND
- 15 BUSINESSES.—If the agricultural producer or
- 16 rural small business under subparagraph (A) is
- 17 an underserved agricultural producer or rural
- 18 small business, the amount paid by that under-
- 19 served agricultural producer or rural small busi-
- 20 ness pursuant to that subparagraph shall be at
- 21 least 10 percent of the cost of the energy
- 22 audit.”;
- 23 (2) in subsection (c)—
- 24 (A) in paragraph (3)—
- 25 (i) in subparagraph (A)—

1 (I) by striking “The amount of a
2 grant under this subsection shall not
3 exceed 25 percent” and inserting the
4 following:

5 “(i) IN GENERAL.—Except as pro-
6 vided in clause (ii), the amount of a grant
7 under this subsection shall not exceed 50
8 percent”; and

9 (II) by adding at the end the fol-
10 lowing:

11 “(ii) UNDERSERVED PRODUCERS.—
12 The amount of a grant provided under this
13 subsection to an agricultural producer who
14 is a beginning farmer or rancher, a veteran
15 farmer or rancher (as those terms are de-
16 fined in section 2501(a) of the Food, Agri-
17 culture, Conservation and Trade Act of
18 1990 (7 U.S.C. 2279(a))), or an under-
19 served farmer or rancher shall not exceed
20 75 percent of the cost of the activity fund-
21 ed by the grant.”;

22 (ii) by redesignating subparagraphs
23 (C) and (D) as subparagraphs (D) and
24 (E), respectively;

1 (iii) by inserting after subparagraph
2 (B) the following:

3 “(C) MAXIMUM PERCENTAGE OF LOAN
4 GUARANTEE.—The portion of a loan that the
5 Secretary may guarantee under this subsection
6 shall be—

7 “(i) in the case of a loan in an
8 amount that is less than \$1,000,000, 90
9 percent of the principal amount of the
10 loan; and

11 “(ii) in the case of a loan in an
12 amount that is not less than \$1,000,000,
13 80 percent of the principal amount of the
14 loan.”; and

15 (iv) in subparagraph (E) (as so redesignated), by striking “subsection (f)” and
16 inserting “subsection (g)”;

18 (B) in paragraph (4)—

19 (i) in subparagraph (A), by striking
20 “3-tiered” and inserting “2-tiered”;

21 (ii) in subparagraph (B), by striking
22 “\$80,000” and inserting “\$150,000”;

23 (iii) by striking subparagraph (C);

- 1 (iv) by redesignating subparagraphs
2 (D) and (E) as subparagraphs (C) and
3 (D), respectively;
- 4 (v) in subparagraph (C) (as so redes-
5 gnated), in the subparagraph heading, by
6 striking “3” and inserting “2”; and
- 7 (vi) in subparagraph (D) (as so redes-
8 gnated)—
- 9 (I) by striking “The Secretary”
10 and inserting the following:
- 11 “(i) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary”;
- 12 (II) in clause (i) (as so des-
13 gnated), by striking “tier I projects
14 and more comprehensive for each sub-
15 sequent tier” and inserting “tier 1
16 projects and more comprehensive for
17 tier 2 projects”; and
- 18 (III) by adding at the end the
19 following:
- 20 “(ii) SCORING.—The Secretary shall
21 establish a scoring mechanism for tier 1
22 project applications that is designed to in-
23 crease program utilization by small- and
24 medium-sized farmers.”;

1 (3) by redesignating subsections (d), (e), and
2 (f) as subsections (e), (f), and (g), respectively;

3 (4) by inserting after subsection (c) the fol-
4 lowing:

5 **“(d) REGIONAL DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS.—**

6 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall carry
7 out regional demonstration projects that incentivize
8 agricultural producers to reduce their carbon foot-
9 print or overall carbon equivalent emissions to the
10 maximum extent practicable through the use of en-
11 ergy efficiency improvements and renewable energy
12 systems.

13 “(2) PUBLICIZATION.—The Secretary shall
14 publicize the results of the regional demonstration
15 projects carried out under paragraph (1).”;

16 (5) in subsection (e) (as so redesignated)—

17 (A) by striking “The Secretary shall” and
18 inserting “Using funds made available under
19 subsection (g)(4), the Secretary shall”; and

20 (B) by inserting “or provided, as applica-
21 ble,” after “conducted”;

22 (6) in subsection (f) (as so redesignated)—

23 (A) by striking “subsection (f)” each place
24 it appears and inserting “subsection (g)”; and

25 (B) in paragraph (1)—

1 (i) by striking “20 percent” and in-
2 serting “25 percent”; and

3 (ii) by striking “\$20,000” and insert-
4 ing “\$75,000”; and

5 (7) in subsection (g) (as so redesignated)—

6 (A) in paragraph (1), by striking subparagraphs (A) through (E) and inserting the fol-
7 lowing:

8 “(A) \$50,000,000 for each of fiscal years
9 2014 through 2023;

10 “(B) \$100,000,000 for fiscal year 2024;

11 “(C) \$150,000,000 for fiscal year 2025;

12 “(D) \$200,000,000 for fiscal year 2026;

13 “(E) \$250,000,000 for fiscal year 2027;

14 and

15 “(F) \$300,000,000 for fiscal year 2028
16 and each fiscal year thereafter.”;

17 (B) by striking paragraph (2) and insert-
18 ing the following:

19 “(2) PROJECT DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE
20 FUNDING.—Of the funds made available for each fis-
21 cal year under paragraph (1) or any other funds
22 made available to carry out this section, not less
23 than 5 percent shall be made available to carry out
24 subsection (b).”; and

1 (C) by adding at the end the following:

2 “(4) ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES.—Of the
3 funds made available to carry out this section for a
4 fiscal year, the Secretary shall use not more than 8
5 percent for administrative expenses.

6 “(5) RESERVATION OF FUNDS.—Of the funds
7 made available to carry out this section for a fiscal
8 year, the Secretary may reserve—

9 “(A) not more than 15 percent for award-
10 ing grants under subsection (c) that support
11 the adoption of underutilized but proven com-
12 mercial technologies; and

13 “(B) not more than 5 percent to carry out
14 subsection (d).”.
