- means the Department of Veterans Affairs.

3	TITLE I—BOARD OF VETERANS'
4	APPEALS MATTERS
5	SEC. 101. BOARD OF VETERANS' APPEALS INTERNSHIP
6	PROGRAM.
7	(a) In General.—Chapter 71 of title 38, United
8	States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol-
9	lowing new section:
10	"§ 7114. Internship program
11	"The Secretary shall establish a competitive intern-
12	ship program within the Department for the purpose of
13	providing an opportunity for high-achieving students at
14	law schools accredited by the American Bar Association
15	to gain experience with the Board.".
16	(b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections
17	at the beginning of chapter 71 of such title is amended
18	by adding at the end the following new item:
	"7114. Internship program.".
19	(c) DEADLINE.—The Secretary shall establish the in-
20	ternship program required by section 7114 of such title,
21	as added by subsection (a), not later than one year after
22	the date of the enactment of this Act.

1	SEC. 102. PILOT PROGRAM ON ESTABLISHMENT OF BOARD			
2	OF VETERANS' APPEALS HONORS PROGRAM.			
3	(a) Establishment.—Not later than one year after			
4	the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall			
5	establish a pilot program to assess the feasibility and ad-			
6	visability of establishing a competitive honors program			
7	within the Department for the purpose of recruiting high-			
8	achieving law school students, recent law school graduates,			
9	and entry-level attorneys for employment with the Board.			
10	(b) Duration.—The Secretary shall carry out the			
11	pilot program required by subsection (a) during the nine-			
12	year period beginning on the date of the establishment of			
13	the pilot program.			
14	(c) Honors Program.—			
15	(1) In general.—Under the pilot program re-			
16	quired by subsection (a), the Secretary shall carry			
17	out a competitive honors program as described in			
18	such subsection.			
19	(2) Priority Consideration.—The Secretary			
20	shall give priority consideration in application for			
21	the honors program to individuals who successfully			
22	complete the internship program established under			
23	section 7114 of title 38, United States Code, as			
24	added by section 101(a).			
25	(3) Student loan repayment benefits.—			

1	(A) In General.—The Secretary shall
2	provide student loan repayment benefits under
3	section 5379 of title 5, United States Code, to
4	each participant in the pilot program who is eli-
5	gible for student loan repayment benefits under
6	such section.
7	(B) AGREEMENTS.—The Secretary shall
8	enter into an agreement with each participant
9	in the pilot program who will receive benefits
10	described in subparagraph (A), in accordance
11	with such section.
12	(C) COMMITMENT.— An agreement de-
13	scribed in subparagraph (B) shall include a re-
14	quirement that the participant will remain in
15	the service of the Department for a period of
16	not less than three years, unless involuntarily
17	separated, in accordance with subsection (c) of
18	such section.
19	(4) Professional Development activi-
20	TIES.—
21	(A) Assignment of mentors.—Not later
22	than 90 days after the date on which an indi-
23	vidual begins participating in the pilot program
24	required by subsection (a), the Secretary shall

assign the participant a mentor who is a mana-

1	gerial employee of the Department outside the
2	participant's chain of command.
3	(B) Assignments to office of general
4	COUNSEL.—
5	(i) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary shall
6	provide each participant in the pilot pro-
7	gram at least one assignment within the
8	Office of General Counsel of the Depart-
9	ment that includes full-time legal respon-
10	sibilities in order to further the profes-
11	sional development of the participant.
12	(ii) Period of Assignment.—An as-
13	signment provided under clause (i) shall be
14	for a period of not less than 120 days and
15	not more than 180 days, or longer at the
16	discretion of the Secretary.
17	(C) OTHER ROTATIONAL ASSIGNMENTS.—
18	(i) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary may
19	provide a participant in the pilot program
20	one or more other short-term rotational as-
21	signments.
22	(ii) Period of Assignment.—An as-
23	signment provided under clause (i) shall be
24	for a period of not less than 30 days and

not more than 180 days, at the discretion
of the Secretary.
(d) Periodic Reports.—
(1) REPORTS REQUIRED.—Not later than three
years after the date on which the Secretary first ac-
cepts a participant into the honors program carried
out under subsection (c)(1) and not less frequently
than once every three years thereafter for the dura-
tion of the pilot program, the Secretary shall submit
to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate
and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the
House of Representatives a report on the findings of
the Secretary with respect to the pilot program.
(2) Contents.—Each report submitted under
paragraph (1) shall include the following:
(A) The findings of the Secretary with re-
spect to the feasibility and advisability of estab-
lishing a competitive honors program as de-
scribed in subsection (a).
(B) Such recommendations as the Sec-
retary may have for legislative or administrative
action to improve recruitment and retention of

staff at the Board of Veterans' Appeals.

SEC. 103. REPORT ON IMPROVING ACCESS TO BOARD OF 2 VETERANS' APPEALS TELEHEARINGS. 3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 180 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall sub-4 5 mit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the Senate 6 and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of 7 Representatives a report on improving access to hearings 8 before the Board of Veterans' Appeals held by picture and 9 voice transmission. 10 (b) Contents.—The report required by subsection 11 (a) shall include the following: 12 (1) Recommendations on the feasibility and ad-13 visability of reimbursing veterans for expenses in-14 curred for travel from the home of a veteran to the 15 location at which a hearing before the Board of Vet-16 erans' Appeals is held by picture and voice trans-17 mission, if the Secretary determines that travel to 18 such location is reasonably necessary for such a 19 hearing; 20 (2) Recommendations on establishment of pilot 21 programs to assess the feasibility and advisability of 22 using other methods that could improve veteran ac-23 cess to hearings before the Board of Veterans' Ap-

peals held by picture and voice transmission from a

veteran's home.

8	ABILITY BENEFIT QUESTIONNAIRE FORMS
9	OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS.
10	Section 5101(d) of title 38, United States Code, is
11	amended—
12	(1) in paragraph (1)(A), by striking "; and"
13	and inserting ", including (except as provided in
14	paragraph $(4)(A)$ —
15	"(i) all disability benefit questionnaire
16	forms available to personnel of the Veterans
17	Health Administration and contracted per-
18	sonnel for the completion of compensation and
19	pension examinations; and
20	"(ii) all factsheets available to such per-
21	sonnel to inform completion of such examina-
22	tions; and"; and
23	(2) by adding at the end the following new
24	paragraph:

1 "(4)(A) The Secretary may exclude from publication under clauses (i) and (ii) of paragraph (1)(A) any form 3 described in subparagraph (B) of this paragraph that the Secretary determines could not reasonably be completed 4 5 to a clinically acceptable standard by someone not an employee or a contractor of the Department. 7 "(B) A form described in this subparagraph is a form 8 that— "(i) was in effect after January 1, 2020; and 9 10 "(ii) has not been published under paragraph 11 (1)."(C) For each form excluded under subparagraph 12 13 (A), the Secretary shall— "(i) list the form on the same internet website 14 15 as the forms published under paragraph (1)(A) with 16 an indication that the form has been excluded; and 17 "(ii) provide with such listing a justification for 18 such exclusion.". 19 SEC. 202. - 10 ABILITY EXAMINATIONS WITH PERSONS REC-
- 11 OGNIZED BY POWER OF ATTORNEY FOR
- 12 PREPARATION, PRESENTATION, AND PROS-
- 13 ECUTION OF CLAIMS.
- 14 (a) In General.—In each contract entered into by
- 15 the Secretary after the date of the enactment of this Act
- 16 for the provision by a contractor of a covered medical dis-
- 17 ability examination, the Secretary shall include a require-
- 18 ment that every communication from a contractor to a vet-
- 19 eran regarding the scheduling of a covered medical dis-
- 20 ability examination be contemporaneously transmitted to
- 21 the person recognized by a power of attorney executed
- 22 under sections 5902, 5903, and 5904 of title 38, United
- 23 States Code, for the preparation, presentation, and pros-
- 24 ecution of claims.

1	(b) Definition.—In this section, the term "covered			
2	medical disability examination" means a medical examina-			
3	tion that the Secretary determines necessary for the pur-			
4	poses of adjudicating a benefit under chapter 11 or 15			
5	of title 38, United States Code.			
6	SEC. 204. DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AFFAIRS OUTREACH			
7	REGARDING CONTACT INFORMATION FOR			
8	CONTRACTORS PROVIDING COVERED MED-			
9	ICAL DISABILITY EXAMINATIONS.			
10	Not later than 120 days after the date of enactment			
11	of this Act, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall, in			
12	partnership with veterans service organizations and such			
13	other stakeholders as the Secretary considers relevant and			
14	appropriate, implement an informative outreach program			
15	for veterans regarding the following:			
16	(1) Contact information for contractors pro-			
17	viding covered medical disability examinations, in-			
18	cluding the telephone numbers from which such con-			
19	tractors may contact veterans.			
20	(2) The requirement for veterans to provide			
21	personally identifiable information when contacted			
22	by such contractors in order to verify their identity.

3	ERANS SERVICE OFFICERS.
4	(a) REPORT.—Not later than one year after the date
5	of the enactment of this Act and after consulting veterans
6	service organizations and such other stakeholders as the
7	Secretary considers relevant and appropriate, the Sec-
8	retary shall submit to the Committee on Veterans' Affairs
9	of the Senate and the Committee on Veterans' Affairs of
10	the House of Representatives a report on improving the
11	support by the Department of Veterans Affairs of govern-
12	mental veterans service officers.
13	(b) Elements.—The report submitted under sub-
14	section (a) shall include the following:
15	(1) Enhanced access to systems.—An as-
16	sessment of the feasibility and current technical limi-
17	tations of providing governmental veterans service
18	officers enhanced access to certain Department sys-
19	tems to better serve veterans those governmental
20	service officers may not have authorization to rep-
21	resent.
22	(2) Intergovernmental liaisons.—An as-
23	sessment as to whether the Department would ben-
24	efit from the establishment or designation of an of-
25	fice or working group within the Department to

1	serve as an intergovernmental liaison between the					
2	Department and governmental veterans service offi-					
3	cers.					
4	(3) Other.—Any other recommendations to					
5	improve how the Department monitors, coordinates					
6	with, or provides support to governmental veterans					
7	service officers.					
8	(c) Definitions.—In this section:					
9	(1) Governmental veterans service offi-					
10	CER.—The term "governmental veterans service offi-					
11	cer" means an employee of a State, county, munic-					
12	ipal, or Tribal government—					
13	(A) who is accredited by at least one vet-					
14	erans service organization to serve as a veterans					
15	service officer; and					
16	(B) whose primary responsibilities include					
17	working as such an officer.					
18	(2) Veterans service organization.—The					
19	term "veterans service organization" means an orga-					
20	nization recognized by the Secretary for the rep-					
21	resentation of veterans under section 5902 of title

1	SEC. 302. FACILITATING DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-
2	FAIRS CONTRACTOR ACCESS TO FEDERAL
3	TAX RETURN INFORMATION NECESSARY FOR
4	CLAIMS PROCESSING.
5	(a) In General.—Section 6103(l)(7) of the Internal
6	Revenue Code of 1986 is amended by adding at the end
7	the following new subparagraph:
8	"(E) Redisclosures.—
9	"(i) In general.—Officers and em-
10	ployees of the Department of Veterans Af-
11	fairs who are specifically designated by the
12	Secretary of Veterans Affairs may redis-
13	close return information described in sub-
14	paragraphs (A) and (B) to contractors of
15	such Department administering (or assist-
16	ing in administering) a program listed in
17	subparagraph (D)(viii).
18	"(ii) Restrictions on use of in-
19	FORMATION.—Information disclosed under
20	this subparagraph shall be disclosed only
21	for purposes of, and to the extent nec-
22	essary in, determining eligibility for, or the
23	correct amount of, benefits under a pro-
24	gram listed in subparagraph (D)(viii).".
