## A BILL

To provide for the issuance of a “Gold Star Families Forever Stamp” to honor the sacrifices of families who have lost a loved one who was a member of the Armed Forces in combat.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Gold Star Families  
5 Forever Stamp Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7 The Congress finds that—

1           (1) Gold Star mothers and fathers and families  
2           are true national heroes, who deserve our deepest  
3           gratitude and respect; and

4           (2) the extraordinary contribution of Gold Star  
5           mothers and fathers and families is beyond measure,  
6           not merely for their loss, but the comfort they self-  
7           lessly provide others and their model of service and  
8           sacrifice.

9   **SEC. 3. GOLD STAR FAMILIES FOREVER STAMP.**

10          (a) IN GENERAL.—In order to continue to honor the  
11          sacrifices of families who have lost a loved one who was  
12          a member of the Armed Forces in combat, the Postmaster  
13          General shall provide for the issuance of a forever stamp  
14          suitable for that purpose.

15          (b) DEFINITION.—For purposes of this Act, the term  
16          “forever stamp” means a definitive stamp which meets the  
17          postage required for first-class mail up to one ounce in  
18          weight, and which retains full validity for that purpose  
19          even if the rate of that postage is later increased.

20          (c) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The stamp described in sub-  
21          section (a) shall be issued beginning as soon as practicable  
22          after the date of enactment of this Act and shall not there-  
23          after be discontinued.
