 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Sergeant Coleman
- 5 Bean National Guard and Reserves Mental Health Act".

SEC. 2. IMPROVEMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH ASSESSMENTS OF MEMBERS OF THE ARMED FORCES DE PLOYED IN CONNECTION WITH A CONTIN GENCY OPERATION.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 708(a) of the National
6 Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2010 (Public
7 Law 111-84; 123 Stat. 2376; 10 U.S.C. 1074f note) is
8 amended by adding at the end the following new para9 graph:

10 "(3) Recall of reserves to active duty 11 FOR POST-DEPLOYMENT ASSESSMENTS.—Under reg-12 ulations prescribed by the Secretary of Defense, the 13 Secretary of the military department concerned may 14 call or order a member of a reserve component of 15 the Armed Forces to active duty for purposes of per-16 forming a mental health assessment of the member 17 under subparagraph (B) or (C) of paragraph (1).". 18 (b) CLARIFYING AMENDMENT.—Paragraph (1) of 19 such section is amended in the matter preceding subparagraph (A) by inserting ", including a member of the re-20 serve components," after "each member of the Armed 21 22 Forces".

1SEC. 3. SUICIDE PREVENTION FOR CERTAIN RESERVES DE-2PLOYED IN CONTINGENCY OPERATIONS3SINCE SEPTEMBER 11, 2001.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 55 of title 10, United
5 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 10741
6 the following new section:

7 "\$1074m. Suicide prevention for certain reserves de8 ployed in contingency operations since
9 September 11, 2001

10 "(a) SUICIDE PREVENTION.—

"(1) TELEPHONE CALL.—The Secretary of De-11 12 fense shall ensure that each covered member receives 13 a telephone call described in subsection (b) not less 14 than once every 90 days during the period in which 15 the covered member remains a member of the Indi-16 vidual Ready Reserve, an individual mobilization 17 augmentee, or a member of the inactive National 18 Guard, as the case may be.

19 "(2) EXCLUSION OF CERTAIN COVERED MEM20 BERS.—A telephone call is not required for a cov21 ered member under this subsection if the Secretary
22 determines that the member was not subjected or
23 exposed to operational risk factors during deploy24 ment in the contingency operation concerned.

25 "(b) COUNSELING CALL.—A telephone call described
26 in this subsection is a call from properly trained personnel
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to determine the emotional, psychological, medical, and ca reer needs and concerns of the covered member.

3 "(c) REFERRAL.—(1) The personnel making a tele-4 phone call described in subsection (b) shall refer a covered 5 member identified as being at-risk of self-caused harm to 6 the nearest military medical treatment facility or accred-7 ited TRICARE provider for immediate evaluation and 8 treatment by a qualified health care provider.

9 "(2) Under regulations prescribed by the Secretary 10 of Defense, the Secretary of the military department con-11 cerned may call or order a covered member to active duty, 12 with the consent of the member, for evaluation and treat-13 ment under this subsection.

"(3) If a member is referred under this subsection,
the Secretary of Defense shall confirm that the member
has received the evaluation described in paragraph (1) and
any necessary treatment.

18 "(d) REPORTS.—Not later than January 31 each 19 year, beginning in 2011, the Secretary of Defense shall 20 submit to Congress a report on the number of covered 21 members who have been referred for counseling or mental 22 health treatment under this section, as well as the health 23 and career status of such members.

24 "(e) COVERED MEMBER DEFINED.—In this section,25 the term 'covered member' means the following:

1	"(1) A member of the Individual Ready Reserve
2	described in section 10144(b) of this title who has
3	deployed to Afghanistan or Iraq in support of a con-
4	tingency operation on or after September 11, 2001.
5	"(2) A member of a reserve component who is
6	an individual mobilization augmentee who has de-
7	ployed to Afghanistan or Iraq in support of a contin-
8	gency operation on or after September 11, 2001.
9	"(3) A member of the inactive National Guard
10	who has deployed in support of a contingency oper-
11	ation on or after September 11, 2001.".
12	(b) Clerical Amendment.—The table of sections
13	at the beginning of chapter 55 of such title is amended
14	by inserting after the item relating to section 1074l the
15	following new item:
	"1074m. Suicide prevention for certain reserves deployed in contingency oper- ations since September 11, 2001.".

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
