Ms. ERNST introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

A BILL

To require the Environmental Protection Agency to issue analyses on the environmental and economic impacts of rules and rulemakings of the Environmental Protection Agency, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “EPA Transparency
5 Act of 2022”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPORT.**

7 (a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

1 (1) ADMINISTRATOR.—The term “Adminis-
2 trator” means the Administrator of the Environ-
3 mental Protection Agency.

4 (2) DATA OF ECONOMIC HARM.—The term
5 “data of economic harm”, with respect to a major
6 EPA-promulgated rule or rulemaking, means data,
7 facts, and figures that can be measured, traced, and
8 validated with respect to the economic harm that is
9 anticipated to be caused by the major EPA-promul-
10 gated rule or rulemaking.

11 (3) DATA OF ENVIRONMENTAL HARM.—The
12 term “data of environmental harm”, with respect to
13 a major EPA-promulgated rule or rulemaking,
14 means data, facts, and figures that can be meas-
15 ured, traced, and validated with respect to the envi-
16 ronmental harm that would be caused without the
17 promulgation or issuance of the major EPA-promul-
18 gated rule or rulemaking.

19 (4) MAJOR EPA-PROMULGATED RULE OR RULE-
20 MAKING.—The term “major EPA-promulgated rule
21 or rulemaking” means a final rule or policy of the
22 Administrator—

23 (A) the promulgation of which was not ex-
24 plicitly authorized by an Act of Congress; and

1 (B) that increases the control or influence
2 of the Federal Government over the property or
3 constitutional rights of an individual as com-
4 pared to before the date of promulgation of the
5 rule or policy, as determined by the Adminis-
6 trator.

7 (5) SMALL BUSINESS.—The term “small busi-
8 ness” means a privately owned corporation, partner-
9 ship, or sole proprietorship that has—

10 (A) fewer than 1,500 employees; and

11 (B) not more than \$38,500,000 in average
12 annual receipts.

13 (b) REPORT REQUIRED.—Not later than 30 days
14 after the date on which a major EPA-promulgated rule
15 or rulemaking is promulgated, the Administrator shall
16 submit to Congress and make publicly available a report
17 that describes, with respect to the major EPA-promul-
18 gated rule or rulemaking, an analysis of—

19 (1) the data of environmental harm; and

20 (2) the data of economic harm with respect to
21 small businesses.

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
