## A BILL

To amend title 38, United States Code, to recognize the service in the reserve components of certain persons by honoring them with status as veterans under law.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Honor America’s  
5 Guard-Reserve Retirees Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROVISION OF VETERANS STATUS UNDER LAW BY**  
 2 **HONORING CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE RE-**  
 3 **SERVE COMPONENTS AS VETERANS.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 1 of title 38, United  
 5 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 107 the  
 6 following new section:

7 **“§ 107A. Honoring as veterans certain persons who**  
 8 **performed service in the reserve compo-**  
 9 **nents**

10 “Any person who is entitled under chapter 1223 of  
 11 title 10 to retired pay for nonregular service or, but for  
 12 age, would be entitled under such chapter to retired pay  
 13 for nonregular service shall be honored as a veteran but  
 14 shall not be entitled to any benefit solely by reason of this  
 15 section.”.

16 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections  
 17 at the beginning of such chapter is amended by inserting  
 18 after the item relating to section 107 the following new  
 19 item:

“107A. Honoring as veterans certain persons who performed service in the re-  
 serve components.”.

20 (1) A bill to amend title 38, United States  
 21 Code, to recognize the service in the reserve compo-  
 22 nents of certain persons by honoring them with sta-  
 23 tus as veterans under law.
