## A BILL

To make America the world's leader in clean energy.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the "Make America the World's Leader in Clean Energy Act".

SEC. 2. SENSE OF THE SENATE.

It is the sense of the Senate that Congress should—

(1) promote investment in clean energy jobs

(2) free the United States from dependence on

3	(4) promote clean energy by retooling the infra-
4	structure and workforce of the United States;
