# S. 4183

Mr. CORNYN (for himself and Mr. CASEY) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Finance

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## A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 relating to authority of U.S. Customs and Border Protection to consolidate, modify, or reorganize Customs revenue functions.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AUTHORITY OF U.S. CUSTOMS AND BORDER**  
4 **PROTECTION TO CONSOLIDATE, MODIFY, OR**  
5 **REORGANIZE CUSTOMS REVENUE FUNC-**  
6 **TIONS.**

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 412 of the Homeland Se-  
8 curity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 212) is amended—

1 (1) in subsection (b)—

2 (A) in paragraph (1)—

3 (i) by striking “consolidate, dis-  
4 continue,” and inserting “discontinue”;  
5 and

6 (ii) by inserting after “reduce the  
7 staffing level” the following: “below the op-  
8 timal staffing level determined in the most  
9 recent Resource Allocation Model required  
10 by section 301(h) of the Customs Proce-  
11 dural Reform and Simplification Act of  
12 1978 (19 U.S.C. 2075(h))”; and

13 (B) in paragraph (2), by inserting “, Na-  
14 tional Account Managers, International Trade  
15 Analysts” after “Financial Systems Special-  
16 ists”; and

17 (2) by adding at the end the following:

18 “(d) AUTHORITY TO CONSOLIDATE, MODIFY, OR RE-  
19 ORGANIZE CUSTOMS REVENUE FUNCTIONS.—

20 “(1) IN GENERAL.—The Commissioner of U.S.  
21 Customs and Border Protection may, subject to sub-  
22 section (b), consolidate, modify, or reorganize cus-  
23 toms revenue functions delegated to the Commis-  
24 sioner under subsection (a), including by adding  
25 such functions to existing positions or establishing

1 new or modifying existing job series, grades, titles,  
2 or classifications for personnel, and associated sup-  
3 port staff, performing such functions, in consultation  
4 with the Office of Personnel Management.

5 “(2) POSITION CLASSIFICATION STANDARDS.—  
6 At the request of the Commissioner of U.S. Customs  
7 and Border Protection, the Director of the Office of  
8 Personnel Management shall establish new position  
9 classification standards for any new positions estab-  
10 lished by the Commissioner under paragraph (1).”.

11 (b) TECHNICAL CORRECTION.—Section 412(a)(1) of  
12 the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 212(a)(1))  
13 is amended by striking “403(a)(1)” and inserting  
14 “403(1)”.

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
