- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 3 SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENT STATUS FOR JAC4 QUELINE W. COATS.
 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding subsections (a)
 6 and (b) of section 201 of the Immigration and Nationality
 7 Act (8 U.S.C. 1151), Jacqueline W. Coats shall be eligible
 8 for issuance of an immigrant visa or for adjustment of
- 10 residence upon filing an application for issuance of an im-

11 migrant visa under section 204 of that Act (8 U.S.C.

- 1 1154) or for adjustment of status to lawful permanent
- 2 resident.
- 3 (b) Adjustment of Status.—If Jacqueline W.
- 4 Coats enters the United States before the filing deadline
- 5 specified in subsection (c), Jacqueline W. Coats shall be
- 6 considered to have entered and remained lawfully in the
- 7 United States and shall be eligible for adjustment of sta-
- 8 tus under section 245 of the Immigration and Nationality
- 9 Act (8 U.S.C. 1255) as of the date of enactment of this
- 10 Act.
- 11 (c) Application and Payment of Fees.—Sub-
- 12 sections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the application for
- 13 issuance of an immigrant visa or the application for ad-
- 14 justment of status is filed with appropriate fees not later
- 15 than 2 years after the date of the enactment of this Act.
- 16 (d) Reduction of Immigrant Visa Numbers.—
- 17 Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-
- 18 idence to Jacqueline W. Coats, the Secretary of State shall
- 19 instruct the proper officer to reduce by 1, during the cur-
- 20 rent or subsequent fiscal year, the total number of immi-
- 21 grant visas that are made available to natives of the coun-
- 22 try of birth of Jacqueline W. Coats under section 203(a)
- 23 of the Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
- 24 1153(a)) or, if applicable, the total number of immigrant
- 25 visas that are made available to natives of the country of

- 1 birth of Jacqueline W. Coats under section 202(e) of that
- 2 Act (8 U.S.C. 1152(e)).
- 3 (e) PAYGO.—The budgetary effects of this Act, for
- 4 the purpose of complying with the Statutory Pay-As-You-
- 5 Go Act of 2010, shall be determined by reference to the
- 6 latest statement titled "Budgetary Effects of PAYGO
- 7 Legislation" for this Act, submitted for printing in the
- 8 Congressional Record by the Chairman of the Senate
- 9 Budget Committee, provided that such statement has been
- 10 submitted prior to the vote on passage.
