(2) NATURAL GAS.—The term "natural gas" 7 8 means any hydrocarbons (other than oil) that are 9 transported by the pipelines described in section 10 3(b). 11 (3) PARK.—The term "Park" means the Denali 12 National Park and Preserve in the State of Alaska. 13 (4) SECRETARY.—The term "Secretary" means

the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Re-gional Director of the National Park Service forAlaska.

#### 17 SEC. 3. PERMIT FOR PROPOSED NATURAL GAS PIPELINES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provision of law, as soon as practicable after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall issue in non-wilderness areas within the boundary of the park right-of-way
permits for proposed natural gas pipelines, as described
in subsection (b).

(b) DESCRIPTION OF PIPELINES.—The proposed natural gas pipelines referred to in subsection (a) are—
