AN ACT

To amend title 36, United States Code, to designate March 9 as U.S. Hostage and Wrongful Detainee Day and to designate the Hostage and Wrongful Detainee flag as an official symbol to recognize citizens of the United States held as hostages or wrongfully detained abroad.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "U.S. Hostage and
5	Wrongful Detainee Day Act of 2023".
6	SEC. 2. DESIGNATION.
7	(a) Hostage and Wrongful Detainee Day.—
8	(1) In general.—Chapter 1 of title 36, United
9	States Code, is amended—
10	(A) by redesignating the second section
11	146 (relating to Choose Respect Day) as section
12	147; and
13	(B) by adding at the end the following:
14	"§ 148. U.S. Hostage and Wrongful Detainee Day
15	"(a) Designation.—March 9 is U.S. Hostage and
16	Wrongful Detainee Day.
17	"(b) Proclamation.—The President is requested to
18	issue each year a proclamation calling on the people of
19	the United States to observe U.S. Hostage and Wrongful
20	Detainee Day with appropriate ceremonies and activi-
21	ties.".
22	(2) Technical and conforming amend-
23	MENT.—The table of sections for chapter 1 of title
24	36. United States Code, is amended by striking the

1	item relating to the second section 146 and inserting
2	the following new items:
	"147. Choose Respect Day. "148. U.S. Hostage and Wrongful Detainee Day.".
3	(b) Hostage and Wrongful Detainee Flag.—
4	(1) In General.—Chapter 9 of title 36, United
5	States Code, is amended by adding at the end the
6	following new section:
7	"§ 904. Hostage and Wrongful Detainee flag
8	"(a) DESIGNATION.—The Hostage and Wrongful De-
9	tainee flag championed by the Bring Our Families Home
10	Campaign is designated as the symbol of the commitment
11	of the United States to recognizing, and prioritizing the
12	freedom of, citizens and lawful permanent residents of the
13	United States held as hostages or wrongfully detained
14	abroad.
15	"(b) Required Display.—
16	"(1) IN GENERAL.—The Hostage and Wrongful
17	Detainee flag shall be displayed at the locations
18	specified in paragraph (3) on the days specified in
19	paragraph (2).
20	"(2) Days specified.—The days specified in
21	this paragraph are the following:
22	"(A) U.S. Hostage and Wrongful Detainee
23	Day, March 9.
24	"(B) Flag Day, June 14.

1	"(C) Independence Day, July 4.
2	"(D) Any day on which a citizen or lawful
3	permanent resident of the United States—
4	"(i) returns to the United States from
5	being held hostage or wrongfully detained
6	abroad; or
7	"(ii) dies while being held hostage or
8	wrongfully detained abroad.
9	"(3) Locations specified.—The locations
10	specified in this paragraph are the following:
11	"(A) The Capitol.
12	"(B) The White House.
13	"(C) The buildings containing the official
14	office of—
15	"(i) the Secretary of State; and
16	"(ii) the Secretary of Defense.
17	"(c) DISPLAY TO BE IN A MANNER VISIBLE TO THE
18	Public.—Display of the Hostage and Wrongful Detainee
19	flag pursuant to this section shall be in a manner designed
20	to ensure visibility to the public.
21	"(d) Limitation.—This section may not be con-
22	strued or applied so as to require any employee to report
23	to work solely for the purpose of providing for the display
24	of the Hostage and Wrongful Detainee flag.".
