## **S.829**

### AN ACT

To reauthorize the Assistance to Firefighters Grants program, the Fire Prevention and Safety Grants program, and the Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response grant program, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "AFG and SAFER Pro-3 gram Reauthorization Act of 2017".

4 SEC. 2. REAUTHORIZATION OF ASSISTANCE TO FIRE5 FIGHTERS GRANTS PROGRAM AND THE FIRE
6 PREVENTION AND SAFETY GRANTS PRO7 GRAM.

8 (a) REPEAL OF SUNSET.—Section 33 of the Federal
9 Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C.
10 2229) is amended by striking subsection (r).

(b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—Subsection (q)(1)(B) of such section is amended by striking
"2017" and inserting "2023".

(c) AUTHORIZATION FOR CERTAIN TRAINING UNDER
ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTERS GRANTS PROGRAM.—
Subsection (c)(3) of such section is amended by adding
at the end the following:

"(N) To provide specialized training to
firefighters, paramedics, emergency medical
service workers, and other first responders to
recognize individuals who have mental illness
and how to properly intervene with individuals
with mental illness, including strategies for
verbal de-escalation of crisis.".

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4 (a) REPEAL OF SUNSET.—Section 34 of the Federal
5 Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C.
6 2229a) is amended by striking subsection (k).

7 (b) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—Sub8 section (j)(1)(I) of such section is amended, in the matter
9 before clause (i), by striking "2017" and inserting
10 "2023".

(c) MODIFICATION OF APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS.—Subsection (b)(3)(B) of such section is amended
by striking "of subsection (a)(1)(B)(ii) and (F)" and inserting "of subsection (a)(1)(F)".

(d) MODIFICATION OF LIMITATION.—Subsection
(c)(2) of such section is amended by striking "prior to November 24, 2003" and inserting "prior to the date of the
application for the grant".

(e) MODIFICATION OF WAIVER AUTHORITY.—Subsection (d)(1)(B) of such section is amended by striking
"subsection (a)(1)(E) or subsection (c)(2)" and inserting
"subsection (a)(1)(E), (c)(2), or (c)(4)".

(f) REPEAL OF AUTHORITY FOR CERTAIN USE OF
GRANT AMOUNTS TRANSFERRED TO ASSISTANCE TO
FIREFIGHTERS GRANTS PROGRAM.—Subsection (a)(1)(B)

of such section is amended by striking "and to provide"
 and all that follows through "of crises".

3 (g) EXPANSION OF STAFFING FOR ADEQUATE FIRE
4 AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE GRANT PROGRAM.—Sub5 section (a)(1)(B) of such section, as amended by sub6 section (f), is further amended by inserting "or to change
7 the status of part-time or paid-on-call (as defined in sec8 tion 33(a)) firefighters to full-time firefighters" after
9 "firefighters".

## 10sec. 4. TRAINING ON ADMINISTRATION OF FIRE GRANT11PROGRAMS.

12 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator of the Federal 13 Emergency Management Agency, acting through the Administrator of the United States Fire Administration, may 14 15 develop and make widely available an electronic, online training course for members of the fire and emergency re-16 17 sponse community on matters relating to the administra-18 tion of grants under sections 33 and 34 of the Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 U.S.C. 2229) 19 20 and 2229a).

(b) REQUIREMENTS.—The Administrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agency shall ensure that
any training developed and made available under subsection (a) is—

(1) tailored to the financial and time con straints of members of the fire and emergency re sponse community; and

4 (2) accessible to all individuals in the career,
5 combination, paid-on-call, and volunteer fire and
6 emergency response community.

7 SEC. 5. FRAMEWORK FOR OVERSIGHT AND MONITORING
8 OF THE ASSISTANCE TO FIREFIGHTERS
9 GRANTS PROGRAM, THE FIRE PREVENTION
10 AND SAFETY GRANTS PROGRAM, AND THE
11 STAFFING FOR ADEQUATE FIRE AND EMER12 GENCY RESPONSE GRANT PROGRAM.

13 (a) FRAMEWORK.—Not later than 90 days after the 14 date of the enactment of this Act, the Administrator of 15 the Federal Emergency Management Agency, acting through the Administrator of the United States Fire Ad-16 17 ministration, shall develop and implement a grant moni-18 toring and oversight framework to mitigate and minimize 19 risks of fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanagement relating 20 to the grants programs under sections 33 and 34 of the 21 Federal Fire Prevention and Control Act of 1974 (15 22 U.S.C. 2229 and 2229a).

23 (b) ELEMENTS.—The framework required by sub-24 section (a) shall include the following:

1	(1) Developing standardized guidance and
2	training for all participants in the grant programs
3	described in subsection (a).
4	(2) Conduct of regular risk assessments.
5	(3) Conducting desk reviews and site visits.
6	(4) Enforcement actions to recoup potential
7	questionable costs of grant recipients.
8	(5) Such other oversight and monitoring tools
9	as the Administrator of the Federal Emergency
10	Management Agency considers necessary to mitigate
11	and minimize fraud, waste, abuse, and mismanage-
12	ment relating to the grant programs described in
13	subsection (a).
