A BILL

To amend section 7014 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 to advance toward full Federal funding for impact aid, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. AMENDMENT TO ESEA.**

4 Section 7014 of the Elementary and Secondary Edu-
5 cation Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 7714) is amended by strik-
6 ing subsections (a) through (d) and inserting the fol-
7 lowing:

1 “(a) PAYMENTS FOR FEDERAL ACQUISITION OF
2 REAL PROPERTY.—For the purpose of making payments
3 under section 7002, there are authorized to be appro-
4 priated—

5 “(1) \$90,313,000 for fiscal year 2024;

6 “(2) \$102,313,000 for fiscal year 2025;

7 “(3) \$114,313,000 for fiscal year 2026;

8 “(4) \$126,313,000 for fiscal year 2027;

9 “(5) \$138,313,000 for fiscal year 2028; and

10 “(6) \$150,313,000 for fiscal year 2029.

11 “(b) BASIC PAYMENTS; PAYMENTS FOR HEAVILY IM-
12 PACTED LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES.—For the pur-
13 pose of making payments under section 7003(b), there are
14 authorized to be appropriated—

15 “(1) \$1,632,476,041 for fiscal year 2024;

16 “(2) \$1,796,710,082 for fiscal year 2025;

17 “(3) \$1,960,944,123 for fiscal year 2026;

18 “(4) \$2,125,178,164 for fiscal year 2027;

19 “(5) \$2,289,412,205 for fiscal year 2028; and

20 “(6) \$2,453,646,246 for fiscal year 2029.

21 “(c) PAYMENTS FOR CHILDREN WITH DISABIL-
22 ITIES.—For the purpose of making payments under sec-
23 tion 7003(d), there are authorized to be appropriated—

24 “(1) \$60,316,000 for fiscal year 2024;

25 “(2) \$72,316,000 for fiscal year 2025;

1 “(3) \$84,316,000 for fiscal year 2026;

2 “(4) \$96,316,000 for fiscal year 2027;

3 “(5) \$108,316,000 for fiscal year 2028; and

4 “(6) \$120,316,000 for fiscal year 2029.

5 “(d) CONSTRUCTION.—For the purpose of carrying
6 out section 7007, there are authorized to be appro-
7 priated—

8 “(1) \$22,906,000 for fiscal year 2024;

9 “(2) \$27,406,000 for fiscal year 2025;

10 “(3) \$31,906,000 for fiscal year 2026;

11 “(4) \$36,406,000 for fiscal year 2027;

12 “(5) \$40,906,000 for fiscal year 2028; and

13 “(6) \$45,406,000 for fiscal year 2029.”.

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
