Designating November 29, 2015, as “Drive Safer Sunday”.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. ISAKSON (for himself and Mr. COONS) submitted the following resolution;
which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

Designating November 29, 2015, as “Drive Safer Sunday”.

Whereas motor vehicle travel is the primary means of transportation in the United States;

Whereas every individual traveling on the roads and highways needs to drive in a safer manner to reduce deaths and injuries that result from motor vehicle accidents;

Whereas according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, wearing a seat belt saves as many as 15,000 lives each year; and

Whereas the Sunday after Thanksgiving is the busiest highway traffic day of the year: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the Senate—

2 (1) encourages—

1 (A) high schools, colleges, universities, ad-
2 ministrators, teachers, primary schools, and
3 secondary schools to launch campus-wide edu-
4 cational campaigns to urge students to focus on
5 safety when driving;

6 (B) national trucking firms to alert their
7 drivers to be especially focused on driving safely
8 on the Sunday after Thanksgiving, and to pub-
9 licize the importance of the day through use of
10 the Citizens Band Radio Service and at truck
11 stops across the United States;

12 (C) clergies to remind their congregations
13 to travel safely when attending services and
14 gatherings;

15 (D) law enforcement personnel to remind
16 drivers and passengers to drive safely, particu-
17 larly on the Sunday after Thanksgiving;

18 (E) motorists to drive safely, not just dur-
19 ing the holiday season, but every time they get
20 behind the wheel; and

21 (F) all people of the United States to un-
22 derstand the life-saving importance of wearing
23 a seat belt and to use the Sunday after Thanks-
24 giving as an opportunity to educate themselves
25 about highway safety; and

1 (2) designates November 29, 2015, as “Drive
2 Safer Sunday”.
