IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

December 17, 2011

Mr. Lee submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations

RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Senate regarding the recent presidential election in the Democratic Republic of the Congo.

Resolved, That it is the sense of the Senate that—
(1) all political leaders in the Democratic Re-
public of the Congo and the supporters of those
leaders should act responsibly, renounce violence
and resolve any disagreements regarding the presi-
dential election of November 2011 through peaceful
constructive dialogue and existing legal remedies;
(2) the authorities of the Democratic Republic
of the Congo should conduct a rapid technical review
of the electoral process to—

1	(A) investigate the cause of any voting
2	irregularities;
3	(B) suggest ways in which governance
4	could be structured to give better effect to the
5	will of the people of the Democratic Republic of
6	the Congo; and
7	(C) provide guidance for future elections;
8	(3) the authorities of the Democratic Republic
9	of the Congo should complete the electoral process
10	with maximum openness and transparency; and
11	(4) the United States Government should en-
12	gage with other governments in Central Africa and
13	ask those governments to reach out to President Jo-
14	seph Kabila and opposition candidate Etienne
15	Tshisekedi to encourage the 2 leaders to embrace a
16	peaceful solution to the potential impasse facing the
17	Democratic Republic of the Congo.
