RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Senate on the necessity of maintaining the United Nations arms embargo on South Sudan until conditions for peace, stability, democracy, and development exist.

- 1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the Senate that—
2 (1) the signatories to the Revitalized Agreement
3 on the Resolution of the Conflict in the Republic of
4 South Sudan, signed on September 12, 2018, have

1 delayed implementation, leading to continued conflict
2 and instability in South Sudan;

3 (2) despite years of fighting, 2 peace agree-
4 ments, punitive actions by the international commu-
5 nity, and widespread suffering among civilian popu-
6 lations, the leaders of South Sudan have failed to
7 build sustainable peace;

8 (3) the United Nations arms embargo on South
9 Sudan, most recently extended by 1 year to May 31,
10 2022, through United Nations Security Council Res-
11 olution 2577 (2021), is a necessary act by the inter-
12 national community to stem the illicit transfer and
13 destabilizing accumulation and misuse of small arms
14 and light weapons in perpetuation of the conflict in
15 South Sudan;

16 (4) the United States should call on other mem-
17 ber states of the United Nations to redouble efforts
18 to enforce the United Nations arms embargo on
19 South Sudan; and

20 (5) the United States, through the United
21 States Mission to the United Nations, should use its
22 voice and vote in the United Nations Security Coun-
23 cil in favor of maintaining the United Nations arms
24 embargo on South Sudan until—

1 (A) the Revitalized Agreement on the Res-
2 olution of the Conflict in the Republic of South
3 Sudan is fully implemented; or

4 (B) credible, fair, and transparent demo-
5 cratic elections are held in South Sudan.
