Mr. ISAKSON (for himself, Mr. CHAMBLISS, and Ms. KLOBUCHAR) submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

Designating November 28, 2010, as "Drive Safer Sunday".

- Whereas motor vehicle travel is the primary means of transportation in the United States;
- Whereas every individual traveling on the roads and highways needs to drive in a safer manner in order to reduce deaths and injuries that result from motor vehicle accidents;
- Whereas according to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, wearing a seat belt saves more than 15,000 lives each year;
- Whereas the Senate wants all people of the United States to understand the life-saving importance of wearing a seat belt and encourages motorists to drive safely, not just during the holiday season, but every time they get behind the wheel; and

Whereas the Sunday after Thanksgiving is the busiest highway traffic day of the year: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That the Senate— 2 (1) encourages— 3 (A) high schools, colleges, universities, ad-4 ministrators, teachers, primary schools, and 5 secondary schools to launch campus-wide edu-6 cational campaigns to urge students to be fo-7 cused on safety when driving; (B) national trucking firms to alert their 8 9 drivers to be especially focused on driving safely 10 on the Sunday after Thanksgiving, and to pub-11 licize the importance of the day through use of 12 Citizen's Band ("CB") radios and truck stops 13 across the Nation; 14 (C) clergy to remind their members to 15 travel safely when attending services and gatherings; 16 17 (D) law enforcement personnel to remind 18 drivers and passengers to drive safely, particu-19 larly on the Sunday after Thanksgiving; and 20 (E) all people of the United States to use 21 the Sunday after Thanksgiving as an oppor-22 tunity to educate themselves about highway

safety; and
