Mr. SCHUMER (for himself and Mr. McCONNELL) submitted the following resolution; which was considered and agreed to

RESOLUTION

To authorize testimony and representation in *United States v. Rhodes*.

Whereas, in the case of *United States v. Rhodes*, Cr. No. 22-15, pending in the United States District Court for the District of Columbia, the prosecution has requested the production of testimony from Virginia Brown, formerly a Chamber Assistant of the Senate;

Whereas, pursuant to sections 703(a) and 704(a)(2) of the Ethics in Government Act of 1978, 2 U.S.C. §§ 288b(a) and 288c(a)(2), the Senate may direct its counsel to represent current or former officers and employees of the Senate with respect to any subpoena, order, or request for evidence relating to their official responsibilities;

Whereas, by the privileges of the Senate of the United States and Rule XI of the Standing Rules of the Senate, no evi-

dence under the control or in the possession of the Senate may, by the judicial or administrative process, be taken from such control or possession but by permission of the Senate; and

Whereas, when it appears that evidence under the control or in the possession of the Senate may promote the administration of justice, the Senate will take such action as will promote the ends of justice consistent with the privileges of the Senate: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That Virginia Brown, a former Chamber
2 Assistant of the Senate, is authorized to provide relevant
3 testimony in the case of *United States v. Rhodes*, except
4 concerning matters for which a privilege should be as-
5 serted.

6 SEC. 2. The Senate Legal Counsel is authorized to
7 represent Ms. Brown, and any current or former officer
8 or employee of her office, in connection with the produc-
9 tion of evidence authorized in section one of this resolu-
10 tion.
