This bill appropriates \$441,600, including \$760,000 from the General Fund for FY 2019, plus \$152,269,400, including \$50,717,500 from the General Fund for FY 2020. These appropriations support the operations and capital acquisitions of state government, including expendable funds and accounts. It transfers another \$9,500 in FY 2020 from the General Fund into other funds and accounts.
