UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation may cost 12 of 13 local health departments around \$1,000 to create and disseminate an informational notice to cosmetology facilities and may result in local health departments fining cosmetology facilities up to \$500 for not posting required notices.

Individuals & Businesses

Cosmetology facilities may pay up to \$500 for not posting required notices.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation could result in a small increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.
