Enactment of this bill could cost the counties statewide \$5,000 one-time in FY 2019 for programming costs to post the names of voters who sign petitions to county websites and \$1,000 each election for additional mailing costs.

Enactment of this legislation likely will not result in direct expenditures from tax or fee changes for Utah residents and businesses.
