Enactment of this bill could generate about \$2,000 in ongoing General Fund revenue, assuming 10 case filings annually beginning in FY 2020.

Assuming 10 cases annually, enactment of this bill could cost the Courts about \$13,000 ongoing from the General Fund beginning in FY 2020 for court processing requirements.
