**Local Government**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

To the extent that new Class B misdemeanors are committed, enactment of this legislation could increase revenue to local governments by about \$350/case for fines/fees. This bill could also cost justice courts an unknown amount in court processing costs and county jails about \$83/day/offender in incarceration costs.

**Individuals & Businesses**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could result in more individuals who form political action committees paying fines; the aggregate impact is unknown. Additionally, to the extent that individuals violate the provisions of this bill, enactment of this legislation could cost certain offenders about \$680/case; the aggregate amount is unknown.

**Regulatory Impact**

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

**Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
