Enactment of this legislation could reduce revenues from the short-term motor vehicle rental tax to the Marda Dillree Corridor Preservation Fund by approximately \$440,000 one-time in FY 2023 and \$510,000 ongoing beginning in FY 2024.

### Local Government

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could reduce revenues from the local option short-term motor vehicle rental tax to county governments that impose this tax by approximately \$1.19 million in FY 2023 and \$1.36 million in FY 2024.

### Individuals & Businesses

UCA 36-12-13(2)(c)

Enactment of this legislation could reduce tax liability from the short-term motor vehicle rental taxes for businesses and customers of motor vehicles shared through a car-sharing business platform by approximately \$1.63 million in FY 2023 and \$1.87 million in FY 2024.

### Regulatory Impact

UCA 36-12-13(2)(d)

Enactment of this legislation likely will not change the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

**Notes on Notes**

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
