UCA 36-12-13(2)(b)

This bill appropriates \$20,000 one-time and \$20,000 ongoing from the General Fund in FY 2018, to the Native American Repatriation Restricted Account.

Enactment of this bill could cost the Division of Indian Affairs \$20,000 one-time and \$20,000 ongoing FY 2018 from the Native American Repatriation Restricted Account for grants to cover reburial costs. Enactment of this legislation could also cost Parks and Recreation \$10,000 annually beginning in FY 2018 from the State Parks Fees Restricted Fund to conduct studies on where to reserve proper burial land in each State Park.
