Enactment of this legislation could increase revenue to local governments by about \$230 per case for fines/fees. Local government entities could experience the following estimated expenditures: 1. Prosecutors - \$812 per case; 2. Public Defense - \$900 per case; 3. County Jails - unknown increase at about \$83 per day per offender in incarceration costs; 4. Local Justice Court - unknown increase. Additionally, this legislation could increase revenues and costs per instance for local health departments up to \$10,000 for storage of seized contraband and up to \$2,000 for proper disposal of seized contraband.

Individuals & Businesses

Electronic cigarette product businesses may pay as a group around \$2,100,000 in FY 2025 and \$512,000 ongoing in FY 2026. To the extent that individuals violate provisions of this legislation, this could cost certain offenders about \$340 per case, however the total amount is unknown.

Regulatory Impact

Enactment of this legislation could result in a large increase in the regulatory burden for Utah residents or businesses.

Performance Evaluation

This bill does not create a new program or significantly expand an existing program.

Notes on Notes

Fiscal notes estimate the direct costs or revenues of enacting a bill. The Legislature uses them to balance the budget. They do not measure a bill's benefits or non-fiscal impacts like opportunity costs, wait times, or inconvenience. A fiscal note is not an appropriation. The Legislature decides appropriations separately.
