Enactment of this resolution allows the State of Utah to accept approximately \$3.54 billion in federal funds provided by Public Law 117-2, The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021. This total includes \$1.65 billion in state funding consisting of \$1.52 billion in State Fiscal Relief Funds and \$136 million for Capital Projects. The Act also includes \$1.89 billion in agency-specific grants as follows: \$1.18 billion for Education, \$519 million for Health and Human Services, \$174 million for Transportation, \$3.75 million for Federal Emergency Management Agency-related expenses, \$3 million for Agriculture and \$4.3 million for grants for other agencies. Upon acceptance and appropriation, the funds can be spent by state and local entities subject to the terms of the federal legislation.
