LONG TITLE
General Description:
This bill appropriates funds for the support and operation of state government for the fiscal
year beginning July 1, 2018 and ending June 30, 2019.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 provides budget increases and decreases for the use and support of certain state agencies;
 provides budget increases and decreases for the use and support of certain institutions of
higher education;
 provides budget increases and decreases for other purposes as described;
 authorizes capital outlay amounts for certain internal service funds;
 authorizes full time employment levels for certain internal service funds; and
provides intent language.
Money Appropriated in this Bill:
This bill appropriates \$508,654,100 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2019,
including:
► \$66,716,600 from the General Fund;
► \$143,961,000 from the Education Fund;
► \$297,976,500 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$20,126,600 in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2019.
This bill appropriates \$95,400 in business-like activities for fiscal year 2019.
This bill appropriates \$4,224,800 in restricted fund and account transfers for fiscal year 2019,
including:
► (\$5,175,200) from the General Fund;
► \$9,400,000 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates (\$3,000,000) in fiduciary funds for fiscal year 2019, all of which is
from the General Fund.
