General Description:
This bill supplements or reduces appropriations previously provided for the use and
operation of state government for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2013.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:

<ul> <li>provides budget increases and decreases for the use and support of certain institutions of</li> </ul>
higher education;
<ul><li>provides budget increases and decreases for other purposes as described.</li></ul>
Money Appropriated in this Bill:
This bill appropriates \$207,576,700 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2013,
including:
• (\$35,004,800) from the General Fund;
► \$242,581,500 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$80,006,800 in business-like activities for fiscal year 2013.
This bill appropriates \$47,998,200 in restricted fund and account transfers for fiscal year
2013, including:
► \$1,214,000 from the General Fund;
► \$46,784,200 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$34,122,000 in transfers to unrestricted funds for fiscal year 2013.
This bill appropriates \$243,305,200 in capital project funds for fiscal year 2013.
