Money Appropriated in this Bill:
This bill appropriates \$20,505,100 in operating and capital budgets for fiscal year 2023,
including:
► \$7,773,700 from the General Fund;
► \$3,702,000 from the Education Fund; and
► \$9,029,400 from various sources as detailed in this bill.
This bill appropriates \$111,400 in expendable funds and accounts for fiscal year 2023.
This bill appropriates \$1,800 in business-like activities for fiscal year 2023.
This bill appropriates \$3,800 in restricted fund and account transfers for fiscal year 2023, all
of which is from the General Fund.
Other Special Clauses:
This bill takes effect on July 1, 2022.
