This bill amends provisions related to the use of a handheld wireless communication
device while operating a motor vehicle.
Highlighted Provisions:
This bill:
 defines terms related to the operation of handheld wireless communication devices;
 prohibits certain uses of a handheld wireless communication device while operating
a motor vehicle on a roadway;
 provides limited exceptions to the prohibition on the use of a handheld wireless
communication device while operating a motor vehicle on a roadway; and
 makes technical changes.

99	(B) the commission of the offense upon which the current conviction is based.
