Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
Section 1. Section 41-1a-418 is amended to read:
41-1a-418. Authorized special group license plates.
(1) The division shall only issue special group license plates in accordance with this
section through Section 41-1a-422 to a person who is specified under this section within the
categories listed as follows:
(a) disability special group license plates issued in accordance with Section 41-1a-420;
(b) honor special group license plates, as in a war hero, which plates are issued for a:
(i) survivor of the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor;
(ii) former prisoner of war;
(iii) recipient of a Purple Heart;
(iv) disabled veteran;
(v) recipient of a gold star award issued by the United States Secretary of Defense; or
(vi) recipient of a campaign or combat theater award determined by the Department of
Veterans and Military Affairs;
(c) unique vehicle type special group license plates, as for historical, collectors value,
or other unique vehicle type, which plates are issued for:
(i) a special interest vehicle;
(ii) a vintage vehicle;
(iii) a farm truck; or
(iv) (A) until Subsection (1)(c)(iv)(B) or (4) applies, a vehicle powered by clean fuel as
defined in Section 59-13-102; or
(B) beginning on the effective date of rules made by the Department of Transportation
authorized under Subsection 41-6a-702(5)(b) and until Subsection (4) applies, a vehicle
powered by clean fuel that meets the standards established by the Department of Transportation
in rules authorized under Subsection 41-6a-702(5)(b);
(d) recognition special group license plates, which plates are issued for:

123	(2) (a) The division may not issue a new type of special group license plate or decal
124	unless the division receives:
125	(i) (A) a private donation for the start-up fee established under Section 63J-1-504 for
126	the production and administrative costs of providing the new special group license plates or
127	decals; or
128	(B) a legislative appropriation for the start-up fee provided under Subsection
129	(2)(a)(i)(A); and
130	(ii) beginning on January 1, 2012, and for the issuance of a support special group
131	license plate authorized in Section 41-1a-422, at least 500 completed applications for the new
132	type of support special group license plate or decal to be issued with all fees required under this
133	part for the support special group license plate or decal issuance paid by each applicant.
134	(b) (i) Beginning on January 1, 2012, each participating organization shall collect and
135	hold applications for support special group license plates or decals authorized in Section
136	41-1a-422 on or after January 1, 2012, until it has received at least 500 applications.
137	(ii) Once a participating organization has received at least 500 applications, it shall
138	submit the applications, along with the necessary fees, to the division for the division to begin
139	working on the design and issuance of the new type of support special group license plate or
140	decal to be issued.
141	(iii) Beginning on January 1, 2012, the division may not work on the issuance or design
142	of a new support special group license plate or decal authorized in Section 41-1a-422 until the
143	applications and fees required under this Subsection (2) have been received by the division.
144	(iv) The division shall begin issuance of a new support special group license plate or
145	decal authorized in Section 41-1a-422 on or after January 1, 2012, no later than six months
146	after receiving the applications and fees required under this Subsection (2).
147	(c) (i) Beginning on July 1, 2009, the division may not renew a motor vehicle
148	registration of a motor vehicle that has been issued a firefighter recognition special group
149	license plate unless the applicant is a contributor as defined in Subsection
150	41-1a-422(1)(a)(ii)(D) to the Firefighter Support Restricted Account.
151	(ii) A registered owner of a vehicle that has been issued a firefighter recognition

special group license plate prior to July 1, 2009, upon renewal of the owner's motor vehicle registration shall:

- (A) be a contributor to the Firefighter Support Restricted Account as required under Subsection (2)(c)(i); or
- (B) replace the firefighter recognition special group license plate with a new license plate.
- (3) Beginning on July 1, 2011, if a support special group license plate or decal type authorized in Section 41-1a-422 and issued on or after January 1, 2012, has fewer than 500 license plates issued each year for a three consecutive year time period that begins on July 1, the division may not issue that type of support special group license plate or decal to a new applicant beginning on January 1 of the following calendar year after the three consecutive year time period for which that type of support special group license plate or decal has fewer than 500 license plates issued each year.
- (4) Beginning on July 1, 2011, the division may not issue to an applicant a unique vehicle type license plate for a vehicle powered by clean fuel under Subsection (1)(c)(iv).
- (5) (a) Beginning on October 1, 2017, the division may not issue a new prostate cancer support special group license plate.
- (b) A registered owner of a vehicle that has been issued a prostate cancer support special group license plate before October 1, 2017, may renew the owner's motor vehicle registration, with the contribution allocated as described in Section 41-1a-422.
- Section 2. Section **41-1a-422** is amended to read:

  - (B) the Department of Veterans and Military Affairs for veterans programs;
- (C) the Division of Wildlife Resources for the Wildlife Resources Account created in Section 23-14-13, for conservation of wildlife and the enhancement, preservation, protection, access, and management of wildlife habitat;

184	(E) the Division of Recreation for the benefit of snowmobile programs;
185	(F) the Guardian Ad Litem Services Account and the Children's Museum of Utah, with

249	(II) the Governor's Suicide Prevention Fund created in Section 62A-15-1103 to support
250	the Live On suicide prevention campaign administered by the Division of Substance Abuse and
251	Mental Health.
252	(ii) (A) For a veterans special group license plate described in Subsection
253	41-1a-421(1)(a)(v) or 41-1a-422(4), "contributor" means a person who has donated or in whose
254	name at least a \$25 donation at the time of application and \$10 annual donation thereafter has
255	been made.
256	(B) For a Utah Housing Opportunity special group license plate, "contributor" means a
257	person who:
258	(I) has donated or in whose name at least \$30 has been donated at the time of
259	application and annually after the time of application; and
260	(II) is a member of a trade organization for real estate licensees that has more than
261	15,000 Utah members.
262	(C) For an Honoring Heroes special group license plate, "contributor" means a person
263	who has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated at the time of application and
264	annually thereafter.
265	(D) For a firefighter support special group license plate, "contributor" means a person
266	who:
267	(I) has donated or in whose name at least \$15 has been donated at the time of
268	application and annually after the time of application; and
269	(II) is a currently employed, volunteer, or retired firefighter.
270	(E) For a cancer research special group license plate, "contributor" means a person who
271	has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated at the time of application and
272	annually after the time of application.
273	(F) For a Utah Law Enforcement Memorial Support special group license plate,
274	"contributor" means a person who has donated or in whose name at least \$35 has been donated

at the time of application and annually thereafter.

(b) "Institution" means a state institution of higher education as defined under Section 53B-3-102 or a private institution of higher education in the state accredited by a regional or national accrediting agency recognized by the United States Department of Education.

- (2) (a) An applicant for original or renewal collegiate special group license plates under Subsection (1)(a)(i) must be a contributor to the institution named in the application and present the original contribution verification form under Subsection (2)(b) or make a contribution to the division at the time of application under Subsection (3).
- (b) An institution with a support special group license plate shall issue to a contributor a verification form designed by the commission containing:
  - (i) the name of the contributor;

- (ii) the institution to which a donation was made;
- (iii) the date of the donation; and
- (iv) an attestation that the donation was for a scholastic scholarship.
- (c) The state auditor may audit each institution to verify that the money collected by the institutions from contributors is used for scholastic scholarships.
- (d) After an applicant has been issued collegiate license plates or renewal decals, the commission shall charge the institution whose plate was issued, a fee determined in accordance with Section 63J-1-504 for management and administrative expenses incurred in issuing and renewing the collegiate license plates.
- (e) If the contribution is made at the time of application, the contribution shall be collected, treated, and deposited as provided under Subsection (3).
- (3) (a) An applicant for original or renewal support special group license plates under this section must be a contributor to the sponsoring organization associated with the license plate.
  - (b) This contribution shall be:
- (i) unless collected by the named institution under Subsection (2), collected by the division;
- (ii) considered a voluntary contribution for the funding of the activities specified under this section and not a motor vehicle registration fee;
- (iii) deposited into the appropriate account less actual administrative costs associated with issuing the license plates; and

307	(iv) for a firefighter special group license plate, deposited into the appropriate account

309	(A) the costs of reordering firefighter special group license plate decals; and
310	(B) the costs of replacing recognition special group license plates with new license

312	(c) The donation described in Subsection (1)(a) must be made in the 12 months prior to
313	registration or renewal of registration.
314	(d) The donation described in Subsection (1)(a) shall be a one-time donation made to
315	the division when issuing original:
316	(i) snowmobile license plates; or
317	(ii) conservation license plates.
318	(4) Veterans license plates shall display one of the symbols representing the Army,
319	Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, or American Legion.
320	Section 3. Section <b>62A-15-1103</b> is amended to read:
321	62A-15-1103. Governor's Suicide Prevention Fund.
322	(1) There is created an expendable special revenue fund known as the Governor's
323	Suicide Prevention Fund.
324	(2) The fund shall consist of donations described in Section 41-1a-422, gifts, grants,
325	and bequests of real property or personal property made to the fund.
326	(3) A donor to the fund may designate a specific purpose for the use of the donor's
327	donation, if the designated purpose is described in Subsection (4) or 62A-15-1101(3).
328	(4) Subject to Subsection (3), money in the fund shall be used for the following
329	activities:
330	(a) efforts to directly improve mental health crisis response;
331	(b) efforts that directly reduce risk factors associated with suicide; and
332	(c) efforts that directly enhance known protective factors associated with suicide
333	reduction.
334	(5) The division shall establish a grant application and review process for the
335	expenditure of money from the fund.
336	(6) The grant application and review process shall describe:
337	(a) requirements to complete a grant application;

338	(b) requirements to receive funding;
339	(c) criteria for the approval of a grant application;
340	(d) standards for evaluating the effectiveness of a project proposed in a grant
341	application; and
342	(e) support offered by the division to complete a grant application.
343	(7) The division shall:
344	(a) review a grant application for completeness;
345	(b) make a recommendation to the governor or the governor's designee regarding a
346	grant application;
347	(c) send a grant application to the governor or the governor's designee for evaluation
348	and approval or rejection;
349	(d) inform a grant applicant of the governor or the governor's designee's determination
350	regarding the grant application; and
351	(e) direct the fund administrator to release funding for grant applications approved by
352	the governor or the governor's designee.
353	(8) The state treasurer shall invest the money in the fund under Title 51, Chapter 7,
354	State Money Management Act, except that all interest or other earnings derived from money in
355	the fund shall be deposited into the fund.
356	(9) Money in the fund may not be used for the Office of the Governor's administrative
357	expenses that are normally provided for by legislative appropriation.
358	(10) The governor or the governor's designee may authorize the expenditure of fund
359	money in accordance with this section.
360	(11) The governor shall make an annual report to the Legislature regarding the status of
361	the fund, including a report on the contributions received, expenditures made, and programs
362	and services funded.
363	Section 4. Effective date.

This bill takes effect on October 15, 2022.

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
