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29	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
30	Section 1. Section 26B-5-112.5 is amended to read:
31	26B-5-112.5. Mobile Crisis Outreach Team Grant Program.
32	(1) As used in this section, "commission" means the Behavioral Health Crisis
33	Response Commission established in Section 63C-18-202.
34	(2) The commission shall provide recommendations and the division shall award
35	grants for the development of up to five mobile crisis outreach teams.
36	(3) (a) Subject to appropriations by the Legislature, and after consulting with the
37	commission, in fiscal year 2025 the division shall award grants for the development of up to
38	four mobile crisis outreach teams.
39	(b) The grants described in Subsection (3)(a) are in addition to the grants described in
40	Subsection (2).
41	[(3)] (4) A mobile crisis outreach team that is awarded a grant under [Subsection (2)]

**26B-5-114.** Behavioral Health Receiving Center Grant Program.

(1) As used in this section:

- (a) "Behavioral health receiving center" means a 23-hour nonsecure program or facility that is responsible for, and provides mental health crisis services to, an individual experiencing a mental health crisis.
- (b) "Commission" means the Behavioral Health Crisis Response Commission established in Section 63C-18-202.
- (c) "Project" means a behavioral health receiving center project described in Subsection (2) [or], (3)(a), or (4)(a).
- (2) Before July 1, 2020, the division shall issue a request for proposals in accordance with this section to award a grant to one or more counties of the first or second class, as classified in Section 17-50-501, to develop and implement a behavioral health receiving center.
- (3) (a) Before July 1, 2023, the division shall issue a request for proposals in accordance with this section to award a grant to one county of the third class, as classified in Section 17-50-501, to develop and implement a behavioral health receiving center.
- (b) Subject to appropriations by the Legislature, the division shall award grants under this Subsection (3) before December 31, 2023.
- [(c) The commission shall provide recommendations to the division regarding the development and implementation of a behavioral health receiving center.]
- (4) (a) Before July 1, 2024, the division shall issue a request for proposals in accordance with this section to award grants to develop and implement up to two behavioral health receiving centers in counties of the third, fourth, or fifth class, as classified in Section 17-50-501.
- (b) Subject to appropriations by the Legislature, the division shall award grants under this Subsection (4) before December 31, 2024.
  - (5) The purpose of a project is to:
- (a) increase access to mental health crisis services for individuals in the state who are experiencing a mental health crisis; and
- (b) reduce the number of individuals in the state who are incarcerated or in a hospital emergency room while experiencing a mental health crisis.

90	(a) identify the population to which the behavioral health receiving center will provide
91	mental health crisis services;
92	(b) identify the type of mental health crisis services the behavioral health receiving

94	(c) explain how the population described in Subsection $[(5)(a)]$ (6)(a) will benefit from
95	the provision of mental health crisis services;
96	(d) provide details regarding:
97	(i) how the proposed project plans to provide mental health crisis services;
98	(ii) how the proposed project will ensure that consideration is given to the capacity of
99	the behavioral health receiving center;
100	(iii) how the proposed project will ensure timely and effective provision of mental
