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## LONG TITLE

### 4 General Description:

5 This bill amends the definition of an electric assisted bicycle.

### 6 **Highlighted Provisions:**

- 7 This bill:
- 8 amends the definition of an electric assisted bicycle:
  - to add a requirement that the cranks be installed at the time of original manufacture;
- 10 and

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- to exclude certain other types of cycles from the definition;
- requires a seller or manufacturer of an electric assisted[-motor] bicycle, as well as other
- devices that are similar to but do not meet the definition of an electric assisted bicycle, to
- ensure that the device has a label indicating what type of device is being sold or manufactured;

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- 26 *Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:*
- Section 1. Section **41-6a-102** is amended to read:
- 28 **41-6a-102**. Definitions.

- As used in this chapter:
- 30 (1) "Alley" means a street or highway intended to provide access to the rear or side of lots
- or buildings in urban districts and not intended for through vehicular traffic.
- 32 (2) "All-terrain type I vehicle" means the same as that term is defined in Section 41-22-2.
- 33 (3) "Authorized emergency vehicle" includes:
- 34 (a) fire department vehicles;
- 35 (b) police vehicles;
- 36 (c) ambulances; and
- (d) other publicly or privately owned vehicles as designated by the commissioner of the
   Department of Public Safety.
- 39 (4) "Autocycle" means the same as that term is defined in Section 53-3-102.
- 40 (5) (a) "Bicycle" means a wheeled vehicle:
- 41 (i) propelled by human power by feet or hands acting upon pedals or cranks;
- 42 (ii) with a seat or saddle designed for the use of the operator;
- 43 (iii) designed to be operated on the ground; and
- 44 (iv) whose wheels are not less than 14 inches in diameter.
- 45 (b) "Bicycle" includes an electric assisted bicycle.
- 46 (c) "Bicycle" does not include scooters and similar devices.
- 47 (6) (a) "Bus" means a motor vehicle:
- 48 (i) designed for carrying more than 15 passengers and used for the transportation of persons; or
- 50 (ii) designed and used for the transportation of persons for compensation.
- (b) "Bus" does not include a taxicab.
- 52 (7) (a) "Circular intersection" means an intersection that has an island, generally circular
- in design, located in the center of the intersection where traffic passes to the right of
- 54 the island.
- (b) "Circular intersection" includes:
- 56 (i) roundabouts;
- 57 (ii) rotaries; and
- 58 (iii) traffic circles.
- 59 (8) "Class 1 electric assisted bicycle" means an electric assisted bicycle [described in
- 60 Subsection (18)(d)(i). equipped with a motor or electronics that:
- 61 (a) provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling; and
- 62 (b) ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.

63	(9) "Class 2 electric assisted bicycle" means an electric assisted bicycle [described in
64	Subsection (18)(d)(ii).] equipped with a motor or electronics that:
65	(a) may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle; and
66	(b) is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles
67	per hour.
68	(10) "Class 3 electric assisted bicycle" means an electric assisted bicycle [described in
69	Subsection (18)(d)(iii).] equipped with a motor or electronics that:
70	(a) provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling;
71	(b) ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles per hour;
72	<u>and</u>
73	(c) is equipped with a speedometer.
74	(11) "Commissioner" means the commissioner of the Department of Public Safety.
75	(12) "Controlled-access highway" means a highway, street, or roadway:
76	(a) designed primarily for through traffic; and
77	(b) to or from which owners or occupants of abutting lands and other persons have no
78	legal right of access, except at points as determined by the highway authority having
79	jurisdiction over the highway, street, or roadway.
80	(13) "Crosswalk" means:
81	(a) that part of a roadway at an intersection included within the connections of the lateral
82	lines of the sidewalks on opposite sides of the highway measured from:
83	(i) (A) the curbs; or
84	(B) in the absence of curbs, from the edges of the traversable roadway; and
85	(ii) in the absence of a sidewalk on one side of the roadway, that part of a roadway
86	included within the extension of the lateral lines of the existing sidewalk at right
87	angles to the centerline; or
88	(b) any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere distinctly indicated for
89	pedestrian crossing by lines or other markings on the surface.
90	(14) "Department" means the Department of Public Safety.
91	(15) "Direct supervision" means oversight at a distance within which:
92	(a) visual contact is maintained; and
93	(b) advice and assistance can be given and received.
94	(16) "Divided highway" means a highway divided into two or more roadways by:
95	(a) an unpaved intervening space;
96	(b) a physical barrier; or

97	(c) a clearly indicated dividing section constructed to impede vehicular traffic.
98	(17) "Echelon formation" means the operation of two or more snowplows arranged
99	side-by-side or diagonally across multiple lanes of traffic of a multi-lane highway to
100	clear snow from two or more lanes at once.
101	(18) (a) "Electric assisted bicycle" means a bicycle with an electric motor that:
102	[(a)] (i) has a power output of not more than 750 watts;
103	[(b) has fully operable pedals on permanently affixed cranks; that were installed at
104	the time of original manufacture;]
105	(ii) has fully operable pedals;
106	(iii) has permanently affixed cranks that were installed at the time of the original
107	manufacture;
108	[(e)] (iv) is fully operable as a bicycle without the use of the electric motor; and
109	$\left[\frac{d}{d}\right]$ (v) is one of the following:
110	(A) a class 1 electric assisted bicycle;
111	(B) a class 2 electric assisted bicycle;
112	(C) a class 3 electric assisted bicycle; or
113	(D) a programmable electric assisted bicycle.
114	[(i) an electric assisted bicycle equipped with a motor or electronics that:]
115	[(A) provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling; and]
116	[(B) ceases to provide assistance when the bieyele reaches the speed of 20 miles
117	per hour;]
118	[(ii) an electric assisted bieyele equipped with a motor or electronics that:]
119	[(A) may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle; and]
120	[(B) is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of
121	20 miles per hour; or]
122	[(iii) an electric assisted bieyele equipped with a motor or electronics that:]
123	[(A) provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling;
124	[(B) ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles
125	per hour; and]
126	[ <del>(C)</del> is equipped with a speedometer.]
127	(b) "Electric assisted bicycle" does not include:
128	(i) a moped:
129	(ii) a motor assisted scooter;
130	(iii) a motorcycle:

131	(iv) a motor-driven cycle; or
132	(v) any other vehicle with less than four wheels that is designed, manufactured,
133	intended, or advertised by the seller to have any of the following capabilities or
134	features, or that is modifiable or is modified to have any of the following
135	capabilities or features:
136	(A) has the ability to attain the speed of 20 miles per hour or greater on motor
137	power alone;
138	(B) is equipped with a continuous rated motor power of 750 watts or greater;
139	(C) is equipped with foot pegs for the operator at the time of manufacture, or
140	requires installation of a pedal kit to have operable pedals; or
141	(D) if equipped with multiple operating modes and a throttle, has one or more
142	modes that exceed 20 miles per hour on motor power alone.
143	(19) (a) "Electric personal assistive mobility device" means a self-balancing device with:
144	(i) two nontandem wheels in contact with the ground;
145	(ii) a system capable of steering and stopping the unit under typical operating
146	conditions;
147	(iii) an electric propulsion system with average power of one horsepower or 750
148	watts;
149	(iv) a maximum speed capacity on a paved, level surface of 12.5 miles per hour; and
150	(v) a deck design for a person to stand while operating the device.
151	(b) "Electric personal assistive mobility device" does not include a wheelchair.
152	(20) "Explosives" means a chemical compound or mechanical mixture commonly used or
153	intended for the purpose of producing an explosion and that contains any oxidizing and
154	combustive units or other ingredients in proportions, quantities, or packing so that an
155	ignition by fire, friction, concussion, percussion, or detonator of any part of the
156	compound or mixture may cause a sudden generation of highly heated gases, and the
157	resultant gaseous pressures are capable of producing destructive effects on contiguous
158	objects or of causing death or serious bodily injury.
159	(21) "Farm tractor" means a motor vehicle designed and used primarily as a farm
160	implement, for drawing plows, mowing machines, and other implements of husbandry.
161	(22) "Flammable liquid" means a liquid that has a flashpoint of 100 degrees F. or less, as
162	determined by a Tagliabue or equivalent closed-cup test device.
163	(23) "Freeway" means a controlled-access highway that is part of the interstate system as
164	defined in Section 72-1-102.

165	(24) (a) "Golf cart" means a device that:
166	(i) is designed for transportation by players on a golf course;
167	(ii) has not less than three wheels in contact with the ground;
168	(iii) has an unladen weight of less than 1,800 pounds;
169	(iv) is designed to operate at low speeds; and
170	(v) is designed to carry not more than six persons including the driver.
171	(b) "Golf cart" does not include:
172	(i) a low-speed vehicle or an off-highway vehicle;
173	(ii) a motorized wheelchair;
174	(iii) an electric personal assistive mobility device;
175	(iv) an electric assisted bicycle;
176	(v) a motor assisted scooter;
177	(vi) a personal delivery device, as defined in Section 41-6a-1119; or
178	(vii) a mobile carrier, as defined in Section 41-6a-1120.
179	(25) "Gore area" means the area delineated by two solid white lines that is between a
180	continuing lane of a through roadway and a lane used to enter or exit the continuing lane
181	including similar areas between merging or splitting highways.
182	(26) "Gross weight" means the weight of a vehicle without a load plus the weight of any
183	load on the vehicle.
184	(27) "Hi-rail vehicle" means a roadway maintenance vehicle that is:
185	(a) manufactured to meet Federal Motor Vehicle Safety Standards; and
186	(b) equipped with retractable flanged wheels that allow the vehicle to travel on a
187	highway or railroad tracks.
188	(28) "Highway" means the entire width between property lines of every way or place of any
189	nature when any part of it is open to the use of the public as a matter of right for
190	vehicular travel.
191	(29) "Highway authority" means the same as that term is defined in Section 72-1-102.
192	(30) (a) "Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation or connection of
193	the lateral curb lines, or, if none, then the lateral boundary lines of the roadways of
194	two or more highways that join one another.
195	(b) Where a highway includes two roadways 30 feet or more apart:
196	(i) every crossing of each roadway of the divided highway by an intersecting
197	highway is a separate intersection; and
198	(ii) if the intersecting highway also includes two roadways 30 feet or more apart, then

199 every crossing of two roadways of the highways is a separate intersection. 200 (c) "Intersection" does not include the junction of an alley with a street or highway. 201 (31) "Island" means an area between traffic lanes or at an intersection for control of vehicle movements or for pedestrian refuge designated by: 202 203 (a) pavement markings, which may include an area designated by two solid yellow lines 204 surrounding the perimeter of the area; 205 (b) channelizing devices; 206 (c) curbs; 207 (d) pavement edges; or 208 (e) other devices. 209 (32) "Lane filtering" means, when operating a motorcycle other than an autocycle, the act 210 of overtaking and passing another vehicle that is stopped in the same direction of travel 211 in the same lane. (33) "Law enforcement agency" means the same as that term is as defined in Section 212 213 53-1-102. 214 (34) "Limited access highway" means a highway: 215 (a) that is designated specifically for through traffic; and 216 (b) over, from, or to which neither owners nor occupants of abutting lands nor other 217 persons have any right or easement, or have only a limited right or easement of 218 access, light, air, or view. 219 (35) "Local highway authority" means the legislative, executive, or governing body of a 220 county, municipal, or other local board or body having authority to enact laws relating to 221 traffic under the constitution and laws of the state. 222 (36) (a) "Low-speed vehicle" means a four wheeled electric motor vehicle that: 223 (i) is designed to be operated at speeds of not more than 25 miles per hour; and 224 (ii) has a capacity of not more than six passengers, including a conventional driver or 225 fallback-ready user if on board the vehicle, as those terms are defined in Section 226 41-26-102.1. 227 (b) "Low-speed vehicle" does not include a golfcart or an off-highway vehicle. 228 (37) "Metal tire" means a tire, the surface of which in contact with the highway is wholly or 229 partly of metal or other hard nonresilient material. 230 (38) (a) "Mini-motorcycle" means a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle that has a seat or 231 saddle that is less than 24 inches from the ground as measured on a level surface with 232 properly inflated tires.

233	(b) "Mini-motorcycle" does not include a moped or a motor assisted scooter.
234	(c) "Mini-motorcycle" does not include a motorcycle that is:
235	(i) designed for off-highway use; and
236	(ii) registered as an off-highway vehicle under Section 41-22-3.
237	(39) "Mobile home" means:
238	(a) a trailer or semitrailer that is:
239	(i) designed, constructed, and equipped as a dwelling place, living abode, or sleeping
240	place either permanently or temporarily; and
241	(ii) equipped for use as a conveyance on streets and highways; or
242	(b) a trailer or a semitrailer whose chassis and exterior shell is designed and constructed
243	for use as a mobile home, as defined in Subsection (39)(a), but that is instead used
244	permanently or temporarily for:
245	(i) the advertising, sale, display, or promotion of merchandise or services; or
246	(ii) any other commercial purpose except the transportation of property for hire or the
247	transportation of property for distribution by a private carrier.
248	(40) "Mobility disability" means the inability of a person to use one or more of the person's
249	extremities or difficulty with motor skills, that may include limitations with walking,
250	grasping, or lifting an object, caused by a neuro-muscular, orthopedic, or other condition.
251	(41) (a) "Moped" means a motor-driven cycle having:
252	(i) pedals to permit propulsion by human power; and
253	(ii) a motor that:
254	(A) produces not more than two brake horsepower; and
255	(B) is not capable of propelling the cycle at a speed in excess of 30 miles per hou
256	on level ground.
257	(b) If an internal combustion engine is used, the displacement may not exceed 50 cubic
258	centimeters and the moped shall have a power drive system that functions directly or
259	automatically without clutching or shifting by the operator after the drive system is
260	engaged.
261	(c) "Moped" does not include:
262	(i) an electric assisted bicycle; or
263	(ii) a motor assisted scooter.
264	(42) (a) "Motor assisted scooter" means a self-propelled device with:
265	(i) at least two wheels in contact with the ground;
266	(ii) a braking system capable of stopping the unit under typical operating conditions;

267	(iii) an electric motor not exceeding 2,000 watts;
268	(iv) either:
269	(A) handlebars and a deck design for a person to stand while operating the device;
270	or
271	(B) handlebars and a seat designed for a person to sit, straddle, or stand while
272	operating the device;
273	(v) a design for the ability to be propelled by human power alone; and
274	(vi) a maximum speed of 20 miles per hour on a paved level surface.
275	(b) "Motor assisted scooter" does not include:
276	(i) an electric assisted bicycle; or
277	(ii) a motor-driven cycle.
278	(43) (a) "Motor vehicle" means a vehicle that is self-propelled and a vehicle that is
279	propelled by electric power obtained from overhead trolley wires, but not operated
280	upon rails.
281	(b) "Motor vehicle" does not include:
282	(i) vehicles moved solely by human power;
283	(ii) motorized wheelchairs;
284	(iii) an electric personal assistive mobility device;
285	(iv) an electric assisted bicycle;
286	(v) a motor assisted scooter;
287	(vi) a personal delivery device, as defined in Section 41-6a-1119; or
288	(vii) a mobile carrier, as defined in Section 41-6a-1120.
289	(44) "Motorcycle" means:
290	(a) a motor vehicle, other than a tractor, having a seat or saddle for the use of the rider
291	and designed to travel with not more than three wheels in contact with the ground; or
292	(b) an autocycle.
293	(45) (a) "Motor-driven cycle" means a motorcycle, moped, and a motorized bicycle
294	having:
295	(i) an engine with less than 150 cubic centimeters displacement; or
296	(ii) a motor that produces not more than five horsepower.
297	(b) "Motor-driven cycle" does not include:
298	(i) an electric personal assistive mobility device;
299	(ii) a motor assisted scooter; or
300	(iii) an electric assisted bicycle.

301 (46) "Off-highway implement of husbandry" means the same as that term is defined under Section 41-22-2.

- 303 (47) "Off-highway vehicle" means the same as that term is defined under Section 41-22-2.
- 304 (48) "Operate" means the same as that term is defined in Section 41-1a-102.
- 305 (49) "Operator" means:
- 306 (a) a human driver, as defined in Section 41-26-102.1, that operates a vehicle; or
- 307 (b) an automated driving system, as defined in Section 41-26-102.1, that operates a vehicle.
- 309 (50) "Other on-track equipment" means a railroad car, hi-rail vehicle, rolling stock, or other device operated, alone or coupled with another device, on stationary rails.
- 311 (51) (a) "Park" or "parking" means the standing of a vehicle, whether the vehicle is occupied or not.
- 313 (b) "Park" or "parking" does not include:
- 314 (i) the standing of a vehicle temporarily for the purpose of and while actually 315 engaged in loading or unloading property or passengers; or
- 316 (ii) a motor vehicle with an engaged automated driving system that has achieved a minimal risk condition, as those terms are defined in Section 41-26-102.1.
- 318 (52) "Peace officer" means a peace officer authorized under Title 53, Chapter 13, Peace
  319 Officer Classifications, to direct or regulate traffic or to make arrests for violations of
  320 traffic laws.
- 321 (53) "Pedestrian" means a person traveling:
- 322 (a) on foot; or
- 323 (b) in a wheelchair.
- 324 (54) "Pedestrian traffic-control signal" means a traffic-control signal used to regulate pedestrians.
- 326 (55) "Person" means a natural person, firm, copartnership, association, corporation,
- business trust, estate, trust, partnership, limited liability company, association, joint
- venture, governmental agency, public corporation, or any other legal or commercial
- 329 entity.
- 330 (56) "Pole trailer" means a vehicle without motive power:
- (a) designed to be drawn by another vehicle and attached to the towing vehicle by means
- of a reach, or pole, or by being boomed or otherwise secured to the towing vehicle;
- 333 and
- 334 (b) that is ordinarily used for transporting long or irregular shaped loads including poles,

335	pipes, or structural members generally capable of sustaining themselves as beams
336	between the supporting connections.
337	(57) "Private road or driveway" means every way or place in private ownership and used
338	for vehicular travel by the owner and those having express or implied permission from
339	the owner, but not by other persons.
340	(58) "Programmable electric assisted bicycle" means an electric assisted bicycle with
341	capability to switch or be programmed to function as a class 1 electric assisted bicycle,
342	class 2 electric assisted bicycle, or class 3 electric assisted bicycle, provided that the
343	electric assisted bicycle fully conforms with the respective requirements of each class of
344	electric assisted bicycle when operated in that mode.
345	[(58)] (59) "Railroad" means a carrier of persons or property upon cars operated on
346	stationary rails.
347	[(59)] (60) "Railroad sign or signal" means a sign, signal, or device erected by authority of a
348	public body or official or by a railroad and intended to give notice of the presence of
349	railroad tracks or the approach of a railroad train.
350	[(60)] (61) "Railroad train" means a locomotive propelled by any form of energy, coupled
351	with or operated without cars, and operated upon rails.
352	[(61)] (62) "Restored-modified vehicle" means the same as the term defined in Section
353	41-1a-102.
354	[(62)] (63) "Right-of-way" means the right of one vehicle or pedestrian to proceed in a
355	lawful manner in preference to another vehicle or pedestrian approaching under
356	circumstances of direction, speed, and proximity that give rise to danger of collision
357	unless one grants precedence to the other.
358	[(63)] (64) (a) "Roadway" means that portion of highway improved, designed, or
359	ordinarily used for vehicular travel.
360	(b) "Roadway" does not include the sidewalk, berm, or shoulder, even though any of
361	them are used by persons riding bicycles or other human-powered vehicles.
362	(c) "Roadway" refers to any roadway separately but not to all roadways collectively, if a
363	highway includes two or more separate roadways.
364	[(64)] (65) "Safety zone" means the area or space officially set apart within a roadway for
365	the exclusive use of pedestrians and that is protected, marked, or indicated by adequate
366	signs as to be plainly visible at all times while set apart as a safety zone.
367	[ <del>(65)</del> ] <u>(66)</u> (a) "School bus" means a motor vehicle that:
368	(i) complies with the color and identification requirements of the most recent edition

369	of "Minimum Standards for School Buses"; and
370	(ii) is used to transport school children to or from school or school activities.
371	(b) "School bus" does not include a vehicle operated by a common carrier in
372	transportation of school children to or from school or school activities.
373	[(66)] (67) (a) "Semitrailer" means a vehicle with or without motive power:
374	(i) designed for carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle
375	and
376	(ii) constructed so that some part of its weight and that of its load rests on or is
377	carried by another vehicle.
378	(b) "Semitrailer" does not include a pole trailer.
379	[ <del>(67)</del> ] <u>(68)</u> "Shoulder area" means:
380	(a) that area of the hard-surfaced highway separated from the roadway by a pavement
381	edge line as established in the current approved "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control
382	Devices"; or
383	(b) that portion of the road contiguous to the roadway for accommodation of stopped
384	vehicles, for emergency use, and for lateral support.
385	[(68)] (69) "Sidewalk" means that portion of a street between the curb lines, or the lateral
386	lines of a roadway, and the adjacent property lines intended for the use of pedestrians.
387	[(69)] (70) (a) "Soft-surface trail" means a marked trail surfaced with sand, rock, or dirt
388	that is designated for the use of a bicycle.
389	(b) "Soft-surface trail" does not mean a trail:
390	(i) where the use of a motor vehicle or an electric assisted bicycle is prohibited by a
391	federal law, regulation, or rule; or
392	(ii) located in whole or in part on land granted to the state or a political subdivision
393	subject to a conservation easement that prohibits the use of a motorized vehicle.
394	[(70)] (71) "Solid rubber tire" means a tire of rubber or other resilient material that does not
395	depend on compressed air for the support of the load.
396	[(71)] (72) "Stand" or "standing" means the temporary halting of a vehicle, whether
397	occupied or not, for the purpose of and while actually engaged in receiving or
398	discharging passengers.
399	[(72)] (73) "Stop" when required means complete cessation from movement.
400	[(73)] (74) "Stop" or "stopping" when prohibited means any halting even momentarily of a
401	vehicle, whether occupied or not, except when:
402	(a) necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic: or

403	(b) in compliance with the directions of a peace officer or traffic-control device.
404	[ <del>(74)</del> ] (75) "Street-legal all-terrain vehicle" or "street-legal ATV" means an all-terrain type I
405	vehicle, all-terrain type II vehicle, or all-terrain type III vehicle, that is modified to meet
406	the requirements of Section 41-6a-1509 to operate on highways in the state in
407	accordance with Section 41-6a-1509.
408	[ <del>(75)</del> ] <u>(76)</u> "Tow truck operator" means the same as that term is defined in Section 72-9-102.
409	[(76)] (77) "Tow truck motor carrier" means the same as that term is defined in Section
410	72-9-102.
411	[(77)] (78) "Traffic" means pedestrians, ridden or herded animals, vehicles, and other
412	conveyances either singly or together while using any highway for the purpose of travel.
413	[ <del>(78)</del> ] (79) "Traffic signal preemption device" means an instrument or mechanism designed,
414	intended, or used to interfere with the operation or cycle of a traffic-control signal.
415	[(79)] (80) "Traffic-control device" means a sign, signal, marking, or device not inconsistent
416	with this chapter placed or erected by a highway authority for the purpose of regulating,
417	warning, or guiding traffic.
418	[(80)] (81) "Traffic-control signal" means a device, whether manually, electrically, or
419	mechanically operated, by which traffic is alternately directed to stop and permitted to
420	proceed.
421	[(81)] (82) (a) "Trailer" means a vehicle with or without motive power designed for
422	carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and constructed
423	so that no part of its weight rests upon the towing vehicle.

492	<u>(f)</u>	A person's actions to knowingly advertise, offer for sale, or sell a vehicle that is not
493		an electric assisted bicycle as an electric bicycle, electric assisted bicycle, electric
494		bike, or e-bike without making the disclosure described in Subsection (8)(d)
495		constitutes prima facie evidence of a deceptive trade practice under Section 13-11a-3.
496	(9) An	individual who violates this section is guilty of an infraction.
