30	(1) Subject to Subsections [(2), (3), (4), and (5)] (3), (4), (5), and (6), the division shall
31	issue a license without examination to a person who has been licensed in a state, district, or
32	territory of the United States if:
33	(a) after being licensed outside of this state, the person has at least one year of
34	experience in the state, district, or territory of the United States where the license was issued;
35	(b) the person's license is in good standing in the state, district, or territory of the
36	United States where the license was issued; and
37	(c) the division determines that the license issued by the state, district, or territory of
38	the United States encompasses a similar scope of practice as the license sought in this state.
