11	This bill makes changes to provisions related to school dropout prevention.

15	prevention and recovery services by either:
16	 contracting with a third party; or
17	 creating a dropout prevention and recovery plan;
18	defines terms; and
19	 makes technical and conforming changes.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

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29	Section 1. Section 53G-9-802 is amended to read:
30	53G-9-802. Dropout prevention and recovery Flexible enrollment options
31	Contracting Reporting.
32	(1) (a) Subject to Subsection (1)(b), an LEA shall provide dropout prevention and
33	recovery services to a designated student, including:
34	(i) engaging with or attempting to recover a designated student;
35	(ii) developing a learning plan, in consultation with a designated student, to identify:
36	(A) barriers to regular school attendance and achievement;
37	(B) an attainment goal; and
38	(C) a means for achieving the attainment goal through enrollment in one or more of the
39	programs described in Subsection (2);
40	(iii) monitoring a designated student's progress toward reaching the designated
41	student's attainment goal; and
42	(iv) providing tiered interventions for a designated student who is not making progress
43	toward reaching the student's attainment goal.
44	(b) An LEA shall provide the dropout prevention and recovery services described in
45	Subsection (1)(a):
46	(i) throughout the calendar year; and
47	(ii) except as provided in Subsection (1)(c)(i), for each designated student who
48	becomes a designated student while enrolled in the LEA.
49	(c) (i) A designated student's school district of residence shall provide dropout recovery
50	services if the designated student:
51	(A) was enrolled in a charter school that does not include grade 12; and
52	(B) becomes a designated student in the summer after the student completes academic
53	instruction at the charter school through the maximum grade level the charter school is eligible
54	to serve under the charter school's charter agreement as described in Section 53G-5-303.
55	(ii) In accordance with Subsection (1)(c)(iii), a charter school that does not include
56	grade 12 shall notify each of the charter school's student's district of residence, as determined

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57 under Section 53G-6-302, when the student completes academic instruction at the charter 58 school as described in Subsection (1)(c)(i)(B). 59 (iii) The notification described in Subsection (1)(c)(ii) shall include the student's name, 60 contact information, and student identification number. (2) (a) An LEA shall provide flexible enrollment options for a designated student that: 61 (i) are tailored to the designated student's learning plan developed under Subsection 62 63 (1)(a)(ii); and (ii) include two or more of the following: 64 65 (A) enrollment in the LEA in a traditional program; 66 (B) enrollment in the LEA in a nontraditional program; (C) enrollment in a program offered by a private provider that has entered into a 67 68 contract with the LEA to provide educational services; or 69 (D) enrollment in a program offered by another LEA. (b) A designated student may enroll in: 70 71 (i) a program offered by the LEA under Subsection (2)(a), in accordance with this 72 public education code, rules established by the state board, and policies established by the 73 LEA; or (ii) the Statewide Online Education Program, in accordance with Title 53F, Chapter 4, 74 75 Part 5. Statewide Online Education Program. 76 (c) An LEA shall make the LEA's best effort to accommodate a designated student's choice of enrollment under Subsection (2)(b). 77 78 (3) Beginning with the 2017-18 school year and except as provided in Subsection $[\frac{(4)}{2}]$ 79 (5), an LEA shall [enter into a contract with a third party to] provide the dropout prevention 80 and recovery services described in Subsection (1)(a), for any school year in which the LEA 81 meets the following criteria: 82 (a) the LEA's graduation rate is lower than the statewide graduation rate; and (b) (i) the LEA's graduation rate has not increased by at least 1% on average over the 83 84 previous three school years; or

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85	(ii) during the previous calendar year, at least 10% of the LEA's designated students
86	have not:
87	(A) reached the students' attainment goals; or
88	(B) made a year's worth of progress toward the students' attainment goals.
89	(4) To provide the dropout and recovery services described in Subsection (1)(a), an
90	LEA may:
91	(a) contract with a third party; or
92	(b) create a dropout prevention and recovery services plan.
93	[(4)] (5) An LEA is not subject to the requirement described in Subsection (3) if:
94	(a) the LEA is in the LEA's first three years of operation;
95	(b) the LEA's average graduation rate for the previous three years is higher than the
96	average statewide graduation rate for the previous three years;
97	(c) the LEA is a special school as that term is used in 34 C.F.R. 300.115; or
98	(d) the quotient of the total number of an LEA's graduating students plus 10, divided by
99	the total number of students in an LEA's graduating class, is equal to or greater than the
100	statewide graduation rate.
101	[(5)] (6) [An] If an LEA described in Subsection (3) contracts with a third party, the
102	<u>LEA</u> shall ensure that:
103	(a) a third party with whom the LEA enters into a contract under Subsection [(3)] (4)
104	has a demonstrated record of effectiveness engaging with and recovering designated students;
105	and
106	(b) a contract with a third party requires the third party to:
107	(i) provide the services described in Subsection (1)(a); and
108	(ii) regularly report progress to the LEA.
109	[(6)] (7) An LEA shall annually submit a report to the state board on dropout
110	prevention and recovery services provided under this section, including:
111	(a) the methods the LEA or third party uses to engage with or attempt to recover
112	designated students under Subsection (1)(a)(i);

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113	(b) the number of designated students who enroll in a program described in Subsection
114	(2) as a result of the efforts described in Subsection $[\frac{(6)(a)}{2}]$ $\frac{(7)(a)}{2}$;
115	(c) the number of designated students who reach the designated students' attainment
116	goals identified under Subsection (1)(a)(ii)(B); and
117	(d) funding allocated to provide dropout prevention and recovery services.
118	$\left[\frac{7}{8}\right]$ The state board shall:
119	(a) ensure that an LEA described in Subsection (3) contracts with a third party or
120	creates a dropout prevention and recovery services plan to provide dropout prevention and
121	recovery services in accordance with Subsections (3) [and (5)], (4), and (6); and
122	(b) report on the provisions of this section in accordance with Section 53E-1-203,
123	including a summary of the reports submitted under Subsection [(6)] (7).
