	Section 1. Section 53B-24-501 is enacted to read:
	Part 5. Medical Education Grant Programs
	53B-24-501. Residency grant program.
	(1) As used in this section:
	(a) "D.O. program" means an osteopathic medical program that prepares a graduate to
	obtain licensure as a doctor of osteopathic medicine upon completing a state's licensing
	requirements.
	(b) "M.D. program" means a medical education program that prepares a graduate to
	obtain licensure as a doctor of medicine upon completing a state's licensing requirements.
	(c) "Residency program" means a program that provides training for graduates of a

55	D.O. program or an M.D. program.
56	(2) The council shall develop a grant program where a sponsoring institution in Utah
57	may apply for a grant to establish a new residency program or expand a current residency
58	program.
59	(3) An applicant for a grant shall:
60	(a) provide the proposed specialty area for each grant funded residency position;
61	(b) identify where the grant funded residency position will provide care;
62	(c) (i) provide proof that the residency program is accredited by the Accreditation
63	Council for Graduate Medical Education; or
64	(ii) identify what actions need to occur for the proposed residency program to become
65	accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education;
66	(d) identify how a grant funded residency position will be funded once the residency
67	program exhausts the grant money;
68	(e) agree to implement selection processes for a residency position that treat applicants
69	from D.O. programs and applicants from M.D. programs equally;
70	(f) agree to provide information identified by the council that relates to post-residency
71	employment outcomes for individuals who work in grant funded residency positions; and
72	(g) provide any other information related to the grant application the council deems
73	necessary.
74	(4) The council shall prioritize awarding grants to new or existing residency programs
75	that will:
76	(a) address a workforce shortage, occurring in Utah, for a specialty; or
77	(b) serve an underserved population, including a rural population.
78	(5) Before November 1, 2023, and each November 1 thereafter, the council shall
79	provide a written report to the Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee describing:
80	(a) which sponsoring institutions received a grant;
81	(b) the number of residency positions created; and

82	(c) for each residency position created:
83	(i) the type of specialty;
84	(ii) where the residency position provides care; and
85	(iii) an estimated date of when a grant funded residency position will no longer need
86	grant funding.

89	(1) As used in this section, "forensic psychiatry" means the provision of services by an
90	individual who:
91	(a) is a licensed physician;
92	(b) is board certified for a psychiatry specialization recognized by the American Board
93	of Medical Specialists or the American Osteopathic Association's Bureau of Osteopathic
94	Specialists; and
95	(c) uses scientific and clinical expertise in legal contexts involving the mental health of
96	individuals.
97	(2) The council shall establish a grant program that will facilitate the creation of a
98	single forensic psychiatrist fellowship program.
99	(3) An applicant for the grant shall:
100	(a) demonstrate how the applicant is best suited for developing a forensic psychiatry
101	fellowship program, including:
102	(i) a description of resources that would be available to the program; and
103	(ii) any resources or staff that need to be acquired for the program;
104	(b) identify what needs to occur for the proposed residency program to become
105	accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education;
106	(c) provide an estimate of how many individuals would be trained in the program at
107	any one time;
108	(d) provide any information related to the grant application the council deems

109	necessary for awarding the grant; and
110	(e) if awarded the grant, agree to:
111	(i) enter into a contract with the Department of Corrections that the applicant will
112	provide for the provision of forensic psychiatry services to an individual:
113	(A) who needs psychiatric services; and
114	(B) is under the Department of Corrections' jurisdiction;
115	(ii) ensure that any individual hired to provide forensic psychiatry services will comply
116	with all relevant:
117	(A) national licensing requirements; and
118	(B) state licensing requirements under Title 58, Division of Occupational and
119	Professional Licensing.
