(1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), a consumer reporting agency may charge a
reasonable fee to a consumer for placing and temporarily removing a security freeze.

- (2) A consumer reporting agency may not charge a fee for placing or removing a
  security freeze if <u>the consumer</u>:
  (a) (i) [the consumer] is a victim of identity fraud under Section 76-6-1102; and
  [(b)-] (ii) [the consumer] provides the consumer reporting agency with a valid copy of a
  police report or police case number documenting the identity fraud[-]; or
- 33 (b) is over 65 years of age.
