32	<u>death</u> or, if the person is employed by another person who is responsible for that person's
33	conduct, also against the employer.
34	[(3)] (4) If a parent, stepparent, adoptive parent, or legal guardian is the alleged
35	defendant in an action for the injury of a child, a guardian ad litem may be appointed for the
