25	(1) (a) There is created the Federalism Commission, comprised of the following nine
26	voting members:
27	[(a)] (i) the president of the Senate or the president of the Senate's designee who shall
28	serve as cochair of the commission;
29	[(b)] (ii) two other members of the Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate;
30	[(e)] (iii) the speaker of the House or the speaker of the House's designee who shall
31	serve as cochair of the commission;
32	[(d)] (iv) three other members of the House, appointed by the speaker of the House;
33	[(e)] (v) the minority leader of the Senate or the minority leader of the Senate's
