<ul> <li>makes technical corrections.</li> </ul>

	Section 1. Section 53-10-202 is amended to read:
	53-10-202. Criminal identification Duties of bureau.
	The bureau shall:
	(1) procure and file information relating to identification and activities of persons who:
	(a) are fugitives from justice;
	(b) are wanted or missing;
	(c) have been arrested for or convicted of a crime under the laws of any state or nation;

- (8) list the name of every missing person with the appropriate nationally maintained missing persons lists;
- (9) establish and operate a 24-hour communication network for reports of missing persons and reports of sightings of missing persons;
- (10) coordinate with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children and other agencies to facilitate the identification and location of missing persons and the identification of unidentified persons and bodies;

167	(1) As used in the section:
168	(a) "Bureau" means the Bureau of Criminal Identification created in Section 53-10-201
169	within the Department of Public Safety.
170	(b) "Division" means the Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health.
171	(c) "Intervention" means an effort to prevent a person from attempting suicide.
172	(d) "Postvention" means mental health intervention after a suicide attempt or death to
173	prevent or contain contagion.
174	(e) "State suicide prevention coordinator" means an individual designated by the
175	division as described in Subsections (2) and (3).
176	(2) The division shall appoint a state suicide prevention coordinator to administer a
177	state suicide prevention program composed of suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention
178	programs, services, and efforts.
179	(3) The state suicide prevention program may include the following components:
180	(a) delivery of resources, tools, and training to community-based coalitions;
181	(b) evidence-based suicide risk assessment tools and training;
182	(c) town hall meetings for building community-based suicide prevention strategies;

183	(d) suicide prevention gatekeeper training;
184	(e) training to identify warning signs and to manage an at-risk individual's crisis;
185	(f) evidence-based intervention training;
186	(g) intervention skills training; and
187	(h) postvention training.
188	(4) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall coordinate with the following to
189	gather statistics, among other duties:
190	(a) local mental health and substance abuse authorities;
191	(b) the State Board of Education, including the public education suicide prevention
192	coordinator described in Section 53A-15-1301;
193	(c) the Department of Health;
194	(d) health care providers, including emergency rooms;
195	(e) federal agencies, including the Federal Bureau of Investigation;
196	(f) other unbiased sources; and
197	(g) other public health suicide prevention efforts.
198	(5) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall provide a written report to the Health
199	and Human Services Interim Committee, by the October meeting every year, on:
200	(a) implementation of the state suicide prevention program, as described in Subsections
201	(2) and (3);
202	(b) data measuring the effectiveness of each component of the state suicide prevention
203	program;
204	(c) funds appropriated for each component of the state suicide prevention program; and
205	(d) five-year trends of suicides in Utah, including subgroups of youths and adults and
206	other subgroups identified by the state suicide prevention coordinator.
207	(6) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall report to the Legislature's:
208	(a) Education Interim Committee, by the October 2015 meeting, jointly with the State
209	Board of Education, on the coordination of suicide prevention programs and efforts with the
210	State Board of Education and the public education suicide prevention coordinator as described
211	in Section 53A-15-1301; and
212	(b) Health and Human Services Interim Committee, by the October 2017 meeting,
213	statistics on the number of annual suicides in Utah, including how many suicides were

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214	committed with a gun, and if so:
215	(i) where the victim procured the gun and if the gun was legally possessed by the
216	victim;
217	(ii) if the victim purchased the gun legally and whether a background check was
218	performed before the victim purchased the gun;
219	(iii) whether the victim had a history of mental illness or was under the treatment of a
220	mental health professional;
221	(iv) whether any medication or illegal drugs or alcohol were also involved in the
222	suicide; and
223	(v) if the suicide incident also involved the injury or death of another individual,
224	whether the shooter had a history of domestic violence.
225	(7) The state suicide prevention coordinator shall consult with the bureau to implement
226	and manage the operation of a firearm safety program, as described in Subsection
227	53-10-202(18) [and], Section 53-10-202.1, and the Suicide Prevention Education Program
228	described in Section 53-10-202.3.
229	(8) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the
230	division shall make rules:
231	(a) governing the implementation of the state suicide prevention program, consistent
232	with this section[7]; and
233	(b) in conjunction with the Bureau of Criminal Identification, defining the criteria for
234	employers to apply for grants under the Suicide Prevention Education Program in Section
235	53-10-202.3, which shall include:
236	(i) attendance at a suicide prevention education course; and
237	(ii) display of posters and distribution of the firearm safety brochures or packets
238	created in Subsection 53-10-202(18)(a)(iii), but does not require the distribution of a
239	cable-style gun lock with a firearm if the firearm already has a trigger lock or comparable
240	safety mechanism.
241	Section 4. Appropriation.
242	The following sums of money are appropriated for the fiscal year beginning July 1,
243	2017, and ending June 30, 2018. These are additions to amounts previously appropriated for
244	fiscal year 2018. Under the terms and conditions of Title 63J, Chapter 1, Budgetary Procedures

245	Act, the Legislature appropriates the following sums of money from the funds or accounts	
246	indicated for the use and support of the government of the state of Utah.
