| R | Responsibility Terms of office Compensation.   |
|   | (1) There is created the Air Quality Policy Advisory Board consisting of the following |

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| 29 | (a) two members of the Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate;                       |
| 30 | (b) three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the speaker of the             |
| 31 | House of Representatives;  |
| 32 | (c) the executive director;  |
| 33 | (d) one representative of industry interests, appointed by the president of the Senate;        |
| 34 | (e) one representative of business or economic development interests, appointed by the         |
| 35 | speaker of the House of Representatives, who has expertise in air quality matters;             |
| 36 | (f) one representative of the academic community, appointed by the governor, who has           |
| 37 | expertise in air quality matters; and  |

| 49 | (3) (a) Except as required by Subsection (3)(b), members appointed under Subsections           |
| 50 | (1)(d), (e), (f), and (g) are appointed to serve four-year terms.                              |

| 52 | the Senate, and speaker of the House of Representatives shall, at the time of appointment or   |
