36	Be it enacted by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
37	Section 1. Section 19-2-128 is enacted to read:
38	<u>19-2-128.</u> Air Quality Policy Advisory Board created Composition
39	Responsibility Terms of office Compensation.
40	(1) There is created the Air Quality Policy Advisory Board consisting of the following
41	10 voting members:
42	(a) two members of the Senate, appointed by the president of the Senate;
43	(b) three members of the House of Representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
44	House of Representatives;
45	(c) the director;
46	(d) one representative of industry interests, appointed by the president of the Senate;
47	(e) one representative of business or economic development interests, appointed by the
48	speaker of the House of Representatives, who has expertise in air quality matters;
49	(f) one representative of the academic community, appointed by the governor, who has
50	expertise in air quality matters; and
51	(g) one representative of a nongovernmental organization, appointed by the governor,
52	<u>who:</u>
53	(i) represents community interests;
54	(ii) does not represent industry or business interests; and
55	(iii) has expertise in air quality matters.
56	(2) The Air Quality Policy Advisory Board shall:

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57	(a) seek the best available science to identify legislative actions to improve air quality;
58	(b) identify and prioritize potential legislation and funding that will improve air
59	quality; and
60	(c) make recommendations to the Legislature on how to improve air quality in the
61	state.
62	(3) (a) Except as required by Subsection (3)(b), members appointed under Subsections
63	(1)(d), (e), (f), and (g) are appointed to serve four-year terms.
64	(b) Notwithstanding the requirements of Subsection (3)(a), the governor, president of
65	the Senate, and speaker of the House of Representatives shall, at the time of appointment or
66	reappointment, adjust the length of terms to ensure that the terms of members are staggered so
67	that approximately half of the advisory board is appointed every two years.
68	(c) When a vacancy occurs in the membership for any reason, the replacement shall be
69	appointed for the unexpired term.
70	(4) The advisory board shall elect one member to serve as chair of the advisory board
71	for a term of one year.
72	(5) Compensation for a member of the advisory board who is a legislator shall be paid
73	in accordance with Section 36-2-2 and Legislative Joint Rules, Title 5, Chapter 3, Legislator
74	Compensation.
75	(6) A member of the advisory board who is not a legislator may not receive
76	compensation or benefits for the member's service, but may receive per diem and travel
77	expenses in accordance with:
78	(a) Section <u>63A-3-106;</u>
79	(b) Section <u>63A-3-107; and</u>
80	(c) rules made by the Division of Finance pursuant to Sections 63A-3-106 and
81	<u>63A-3-107.</u>
82	(7) The department shall provide staff support for the advisory board.
