Section 1. Section 49-19-401 is amended to read:
49-19-401. Eligibility for an allowance Governor Legislator.

87	(c) 60% if the member has accrued 6 or more years of service credit; and
88	(d) 40% if the member has accrued 4 or more years of service credit.
