Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah:

WHEREAS, Article V of the United States Constitution provides authority for a convention to be called by the United States Congress for the purpose of proposing amendments to the Constitution upon application of two-thirds of the legislatures of the separate states; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature of the state of Utah favors the proposal and ratification of an amendment to the United States Constitution providing that an increase in the federal debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the separate states:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah, under Article V of the United States Constitution, respectfully applies for a convention to be called by the United States Congress for the purpose of proposing an amendment to the United States Constitution providing that an increase in the federal debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the separate states.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the amendments convention contemplated by this application must be focused entirely upon and exclusively limited to the subject matter of proposing for ratification an amendment to the Constitution of the United States providing that an increase in the federal debt requires approval from a majority of the legislatures of the separate states.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah intends that this application be a continuing application in accordance with Article V of the United States Constitution until at least two-thirds of the legislatures of the separate states have made application for an equivalently limited convention.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legislature of the state of Utah strongly urges the presiding officers of each house of each legislature of the separate states to make application to the United States Congress for the calling of a convention as provided in this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the President of the United States, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the members of Utah's congressional delegation, and to the presiding officers of each house of the separate state 59 legislatures.
