This joint resolution of the Legislature requests a study and report on recommendations
for telegovernment.
Highlighted Provisions:
This resolution:
 requests that legislative staff, working with the Utah Education and Telehealth
Network, study best practices and policies related to expanding the state's current
telegovernment services; and
 requires a report with recommendations for telegovernment be delivered to the
Government Operations Interim Committee and the Public Utilities, Energy, and
Technology Interim Committee no later than November 30, 2019.

Be it resolved by the Legislature of the state of Utah:
WHEREAS, engagement between constituents and their legislators is a core aspect of
representative democracy;
WHEREAS, providing online streaming of audio during legislative committee meetings
for over 12 years and audio and video during legislative floor time for over 16 years has

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28	enhanced Utahns' access to the legislative process;
29	WHEREAS, the electronic posting of all audio, video, and legislative documents to the
30	Legislature's website has resulted in the website's recognition by the National Conference of
31	State Legislatures for the Online Democracy Award in 2005 and 2014 as a dependable resource
32	for legislators, constituents, and professionals;
33	WHEREAS, further expanding constituents' access to the legislative process in the
34	states of Arizona and Alaska through technology, such as providing platforms for electronic
35	interaction between constituents and legislators during committee meetings and floor time, has
36	proven beneficial;
37	WHEREAS, according to the United States Census Bureau's 2017 data, 93.5% of
38	Utahns reside outside of the state's capital city, and 83.7% of all Utah households possess a
39	broadband Internet subscription; and
40	WHEREAS, expanding the Legislature's current telegovernment services through
41	teleconferencing and other technological means would ensure greater participation in the
42	legislative process for those residents living outside the capital city:
43	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Legislature requests a joint study be
44	carried out by legislative information technology staff, Office of Legislative Research and
45	General Counsel staff, and the Utah Education and Telehealth Network to determine:
46	(1) network connectivity and bandwidth capacity related to the expansion of audio and
47	video teleconferencing;
48	(2) platforms for delivering the expanded services;
49	(3) whether a decentralized or centralized model for delivering the expanded services is
50	most appropriate;
51	(4) the level of local government involvement by engaging with the Utah Association
52	of Counties and the Utah League of Cities and Towns throughout the study;
53	(5) the amount of time and for which legislative meetings the expanded services will
54	be offered throughout the year;
55	(6) the applicability of the expanded services to those citizen legislators who live great
56	distances from the capital city;
57	(7) issues related to data privacy and security;
58	(8) best practices and policies related to accessibility issues due to disability;

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(9) issues related to free speech;
(10) potential costs and staffing needs to implement the expanded services; and
(11) other relevant issues necessary in the consideration of expanding the Legislature's
telegovernment services.
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the aforementioned study:
(1) focus on whether expanding access to the legislative process through technology
has implications regarding Title 52, Chapter 4, Open and Public Meetings Act, Title 63G,

- 66 Chapter 2, Government Records Access and Management Act, and Section 508 of the
- 67 Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 29 U.S.C. 794d; and
- 68 (2) be reported to the Government Operations Interim Committee and the Public
- 69 Utilities, Energy, and Technology Interim Committee no later than November 30, 2019.
