31	Section 1. HR1-7-101 is amended to read:
32	HR1-7-101. Commendation or condolence citations Types of citations Use of
33	citations.
34	(1) As used in this chapter:
35	(a) (i) "Citation" means a certificate issued to honor or commend an individual who is
36	a resident of Utah, or a group of individuals who are residents of Utah, or to express
37	condolences to the family of a deceased individual.
38	(ii) A citation to honor or commend the same Utah resident should not be issued more
39	than once every 10 years.
40	[(iii)] (iii) "Citation" includes a legislator citation, a House of Representatives citation,
41	and a Utah Legislature citation.
42	(b) "House of Representatives citation" means a citation issued on behalf of the Utah
43	House of Representatives.
44	(c) "Legislator citation" means a citation issued on behalf of an individual
45	representative.
46	(d) "Utah Legislature citation" means a citation issued on behalf of both houses of the
47	Utah Legislature.
48	(2) Representatives shall use a citation to express the commendation or condolence of a
49	representative, the Utah House of Representatives, or the Utah Legislature.
50	Section 2. HR2-4-102 is amended to read:
51	HR2-4-102. Representatives' chairs and seating on the House floor.
52	(1) [When the House is convened in session, no] No one other than the speaker [or a
53	representative] may occupy the chair or use the desk of the speaker [or any representative],
54	without the speaker's authorization.
55	(2) When the House is convened in session, only the representative assigned to a desk
56	and chair may occupy the chair or use the desk, except that a legislator may sit in the chair of

70	(1) (a) News media with House press credentials shall be admitted to the House

73	area designated for the news media and may not enter the floor of the House, the circle, lounge,
74	or the speaker's dais.
75	(2) (a) With permission of the speaker or the speaker's designee, the news media may
76	conduct and record interviews in the House lounge, halls, available committee rooms, or in the
77	House chamber or gallery.

89	(1) Except as provided in Subsection (2), a majority of a standing committee is a
90	quorum.
91	(2) In determining whether a quorum is present, the speaker, majority leader, majority
92	whip, assistant majority whip, House Rules Committee chair, Executive Appropriations
93	Committee chair, Executive Appropriations Committee vice chair, minority leader, minority
94	whip, assistant minority whip, and the fourth member of leadership from the minority party are
95	not counted in determining a quorum for a standing committee, except during the time that the
96	representative is present at the meeting.
97	Section 5. HR4-1-101 is amended to read:
98	HR4-1-101. Definitions.
99	(1) "Appropriations bill" means a bill that appropriates money and makes no change to
100	statute.
101	(2) "Constitutional majority vote" means that the matter requires <u>at least</u> 38 votes to
102	pass on the House floor.
103	(3) "Constitutional two-thirds vote" means that the matter requires <u>at least</u> 50 votes to
104	pass on the House floor.
105	(4) "Majority vote" means that the matter requires the votes of <u>at least</u> a majority of
106	[those present] a quorum to pass on the House floor.
107	(5) "Two-thirds vote" means that the matter requires the vote of <u>at least</u> two-thirds of
108	[those present] a quorum to pass on the House floor.
109	(6) "Point of order" means a question raised by a representative about whether or not
110	there has been a breach of order, a breach of rules, or a breach of established parliamentary
111	practice.
112	(7) "Presiding officer" means the person presiding over the Utah House of

120	HR4-4-101. Committee reports Second reading calendar.	
121	(1) The chief clerk of the House or the chief clerk's designee shall:	
122	(a) read to the House each standing committee report submitted to the House; and	
123	(b) read the legislation by title unless the House suspends this requirement by a	
124	two-thirds vote.	
125	[(2) The adoption of the House standing committee report is the second reading of each	
126	piece of legislation referred to in the report.]	
127	[(3)] (2) (a) If the House passes a motion to adopt the committee report, the	
128	amendments and substitutes adopted by the committee and identified on the committee report
