34	(b) headlights and taillights when operated between sunset and sunrise;
35	(c) a noise control device and except for a snowmobile, a spark arrestor device; and
36	(d) a safety flag, red or orange in color and a minimum of six by 12 inches, attached to
37	the off-highway vehicle at least eight feet above the surface of level ground[;] or to the
38	protective headgear of a person operating the off-highway vehicle at least 18 inches above the
39	top of the person's head, when operated on sand dunes designated by the board.
40	(2) In accordance with Title 63G, Chapter 3, Utah Administrative Rulemaking Act, the
41	board may make rules which set standards for the equipment and which designate sand dunes
42	where safety flags are required under Subsection (1).
43	(3) An off-highway implement of husbandry used only in agricultural operations and
44	not operated on a highway, is exempt from the provisions of this section.
